Psa. 63:1 O God, "You are my God; I shall seek You ¹earnestly;

My soul ^bthirsts for You, my flesh ²yearns for You,

Targum

Psa. 63:1 A psalm of David, when he was in the wilderness in the territory of the tribe of Judah. ² O God, you are my strength; I will arise in the morning in your presence; my soul thirsts for you, my flesh yearns for you, in a barren and weary land, without water. ³ Thus I have seen you in the holy place; purify me to see your strength and your glory. 4 For better is the favor that you show to the righteous in the age to come than the life you have given to the wicked in this age; therefore my lips will praise you. ⁵ Thus will I bless you in my life in this age; in the name of your word I will spread my hands in prayer in the age to come. ⁶ My soul will be satisfied as with fat and oil, and my mouth shall sing [with] lips of praise. 7 If I have remembered you on my bed, in the nightwatch I will meditate on your word. 8 For you were a helper to me, and in the shade of your presence I will be glad. 9 My soul has followed close behind your Torah; your right hand has supported me. 10 But they will seek my soul for the grave; they will enter the lowest part of the earth. 11 They will fear him on account of the blow of the sword; they will be the portion of jackals. ¹² And the king will rejoice in the word of God; all who swear by his word will sing praise, for the mouth of those who speak deceit will be stifled.

Spiritual Awareness

Introduction

David discloses his spiritual thirst while in the wilderness, pursued by Saul's men trying to kill him. He built a fortress of faith that shielded him from what was happening outside his hiding place.

Verse one

David came to realize that the LORD is not impersonal. The LORD wants a relationship with all the souls on the earth.

O God, You are my God; at early dawn will I seek You. My soul thirsts for You, my flesh longs for You in the barren land, and it grows faith without water.

Verses two & three

David developed a kind of spiritual perception of the heart rather than that of the eye. The LORD cannot be seen. However, the presence of the LORD through the Shekinah can be sensed. During David's isolation, his spirit could feel the presence of the LORD with him.

Thus I have perceived You in the Sanctuary to see Your invincible power and glory.

The mercy and love from the Sefirah Chesed are better than life; thus, my lips were wont to praise you.

Verse four

רבי ביי (b'sheem'cha asa kafa) – "lift up my hands in your Name." This phrase references the palm of the hand that is bent and about to close to grasp an object. A hand in this position, but empty, raised to God, symbolizes a plea to Him to supply us with what we lack.

So will I also bless You now through my life; in Your Name shall I lift up my hands.

Verse five

When David connected with the LORD, his spiritual thirst was satisfied.

Then my soul shall be satisfied as with fat and marrow, and my mouth will praise Your mighty acts with joyous lips.

Verses six & seven

David said that he felt the LORD's presence through the Shekinah while on a couch, which was most likely in the palace. He could feel the LORD's presence while in the cave.

While [in days past] I remembered You upon my couch, I will now meditate upon You during night watches.

For You have been my help, and in the shadow of Your wings will I joyfully sing.

Verse eight

My soul cleaves after You; Your right hand has held me fast.

Verse nine

Saul's men chased David into the Judean wilderness, and they believed that they would capture and kill David.

But they seek my soul to destroy it; it shall go into the nethermost depths of the earth.

Verse ten

They who would have let it be spent by the sword shall be the prey of foxes.

Verse eleven

Even with Saul's men chasing him, David still paid homage to his king. He was sincere in his thoughts about King Saul.

But let the king rejoice in God, let anyone that swears by him glory; for the mouths of them that utter lies shall fall silent.
