The second digit indicates the geographical area of the school (1 = Castellón; 3 = Seville). The third digit indicates the school number within each geographic area. The fourth digit indicates the classroom within this school. The fifth and sixth digits are the list number of the child in the classroom the first time he/she participated in the investigation (new children are assigned the first available list number in that classroom). The identification code is assigned the first time the child enters in the participants' sample using the digits corresponding to that moment, and it is never modified, even if the child changes school or classroom, or even cohort. ¹ This measure was used with different subsamples in each school year. In the cohorts CC and IC, it has been used with a selected sample of average and rejected children in each class at the time evaluated: T1pre, T2post, T4post, and with the whole student-body of the class at T6post. In the cohort CS, it has been used with a selected sample at T1pre and T2post. In addition, in the IC cohort at T4post and T6post, two questionnaires were sent to each household, one for each of the adults responsible for the child's education.
