Psalm 90

This research project will examine the 150 psalms for the spiritual awareness each Psalm offers. Each Psalm will be examined by its language and the commentary of the Sages. Each verse of the Psalm will be rewritten using the intent of the language and spiritual commentary to convey its spiritual lesson.

Targum

Psa. 90:1 The prayer that Moses the prophet of the LORD prayed when the people, the house of Israel, sinned in the wilderness. He raised his voice and thus he said: O LORD, the dwelling of whose presence is in heaven, you have been for us a helper in every generation.² When it was manifest in your presence that your people were going to sin, you established repentance; before ever the mountains were lifted up and the earth and the world's inhabitants created, and from this age to the age to come, you are God.³ You will return a son of man to death because of his sin; and [yet] you have said, "Repent, O sons of men." ⁴ For a thousand years in your eyes are considered in your presence like a yesterday, for it will pass; and like a watch in the night. ⁵ And if they do not repent, death will come upon them, they will be as those who are sleeping; and in the age to come, they will disappear like crumbling grass. [ANOTHER TARGUM: You made them drink the cup of cursing; they became like a drunken man in his sleep.]⁶ Their deeds are like grass that in the morning will spring up and multiply; in the evening it fades and dries up from the heat.⁷ For we have been destroyed by your harshness, and by your anger we have been terrified. 8 You have set our sins in front of you, the iniquities of our youth before the light of your face. 9 For all our days have been removed from your presence in your anger; we have completed the days of our lives like a vapor of the mouth in winter.¹⁰ The days of our years in this age are seventy years, quickly passing; and if [one is] in strength, eighty years; but most of them are toil and deceit for the guilty, for they pass in haste and fly away to the morning. ¹¹ Who is he who knows how to turn back the force of your harshness? - except the righteous, who fear you, appease your anger. ¹² Who is right to teach us to number our days, except the prophet, whose heart pours forth wisdom?¹³ Turn, O LORD – how long will you afflict us? – and turn from the harm that you commanded to do to your servants. ¹⁴ Satisfy us with your goodness in the age that is likened to a morning, and we will rejoice and be glad in all our days. ¹⁵ Gladden us like the days that you afflicted us, like the years that we saw harm. ¹⁶ Let the works of your miracles appear to your servants, and let your splendor be upon their sons.¹⁷ And may the pleasantness of the Garden of Eden be upon us from the presence of the LORD our God, and the works of our hands will be established by him.

Spiritual Awareness

Introduction

This Psalm starts the fourth book of the Psalms. The first eleven works of the fourth book were composed by Moses. The sage Rashi explains that these Psalms were Moses's blessings on eleven tribes. Simeon was excluded from the blessings because they held an orgy (Numbers 25:1-15). The sage Radak explained that David found these eleven Psalms in an old manuscript to which the authorship of Moses had traditionally been ascribed. David decided to adapt these Psalms into his book of Psalms.

Verse five

The LORD will often allow a thousand years to stream away like raindrops on the earth. It is a process of regeneration and restoration. When it is over, there is a renewed vigor like a fresh young sprout of grass.

You let them flow away; sleep they become, but in the morning, it renews its vigor fresh as grass.

Verse 12

All the happiness humans can live in comes from the blissful certainty that they have lived all their years, days, hours, and minutes on earth in loyalty to the LORD.

So teach us to number our days, then we shall bring home a heart of wisdom.

Verse fourteen

Satisfy us with the loving-kindness of the Sefirah Chesed in the morning; then, we shall exult and be glad in our days.
