Targum

Psa. 98:1 A psalm and prophecy. Sing before the LORD a new hymn, for he has done wonders; his right hand has brought redemption, and the arm of his holy presence. ² The LORD has made known his redemption; in the sight of the Gentiles he has revealed his righteousness. ³ He has called to mind his goodness and his truth to the house of Israel, and all the ends of the earth have seen the redemption of our God. ⁴ Give voice in the presence of the LORD, all inhabitants of the earth; rejoice and give praise and make music. ⁵ Sing in the presence of the LORD with harps, with harps and the sound of musical instruments. ⁶ With trumpets and the sound of the horn, give voice in the presence of the king, the LORD. ⁷ Let the sea call out, and its fullness; the world and all who dwell upon it. ⁸ Let the rivers smite their palms; as one, let the mountains sing aloud – ⁹ In the presence of the LORD, for he has come to judge the earth; he will judge the world in righteousness, and the peoples with integrity.

Spiritual Awareness

Introduction

This Psalm was composed by Moses and dedicated to the tribe of Naftali (Deuteronomy 33:23). The love for the LORD that Naftali showed describes the universal abundance and peace which will envelop the earth in the Messianic era. Israel will merit exceptional tranquility and peace of mind, which will prompt them to sing to the LORD.

Notes on this Psalm

This Psalm speaks about the upcoming messianic age. Verses seven to nine describe allegorically what will happen upon the earth. The people who have sinned and not repented will discover their time is up. The LORD will sweep them from the world like a sea roaring toward shore. The earth will rejoice because of what is to come in this era. It is not a love for destruction but rather a rebuilding of all of humanity's world based on the guarantee of growth leading to lasting salvation. When the wicked are removed from the earth, the humans remaining will discover it is easier to serve the LORD. They will never receive any hindrance to doing what the LORD expects all humans to do, that is, to follow the ways of the Torah.
