
## CALL FOR BOOK CHAPTERS

For example: Avoid writing Public Health Pract (Oxf) instead of "Oxford Handbook of Public Health Practice". Use citation tools like bibme.org or citationmachine.net or any other online citation tool to avoid errors.

We'll select only one paper from a country. Just mention country, author details (name, affiliation, and email) at the top of the manuscript. References should be from journal articles, preferably from any Scopus indexed or PubMed-listed journals. Your submission will be disqualified if you use references from other sources. Choose only the latest information for your submission (preferably from 2020 to the present date).
