8.- Let's Practice!

- Then, each week take the challenge to try a new rule of composition: intersection points, symmetries, isolating elements, lines, vanishing points and roads, and composing corners.

Keep in mind...

- Clean the camera.
- Think about the point of view (use existing elements such as vegetation).
- It doesn't have to come out all in one picture.
- Think about the details.
- Use filters, at specific times.
- Do not use the zoom.
- Think about where it is and how we use light.
