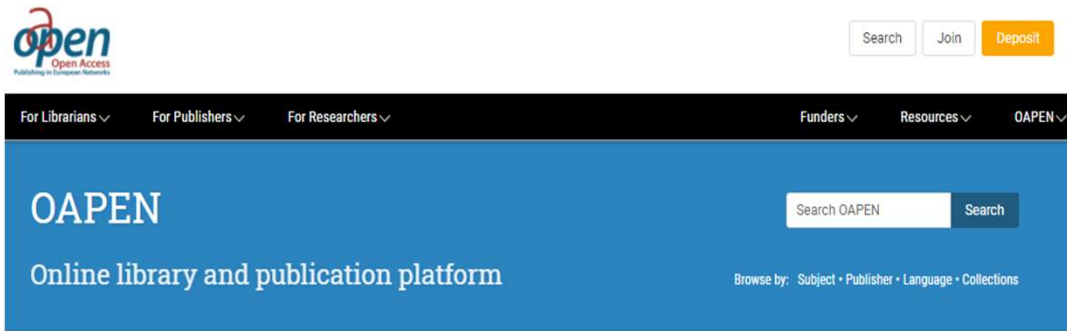

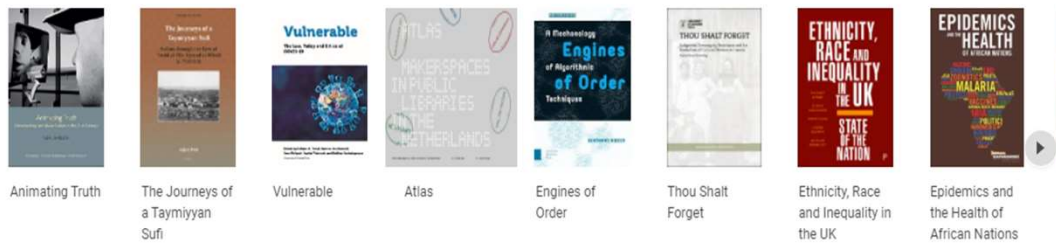


OAPEN OA Books Toolkit – public information resource for authors

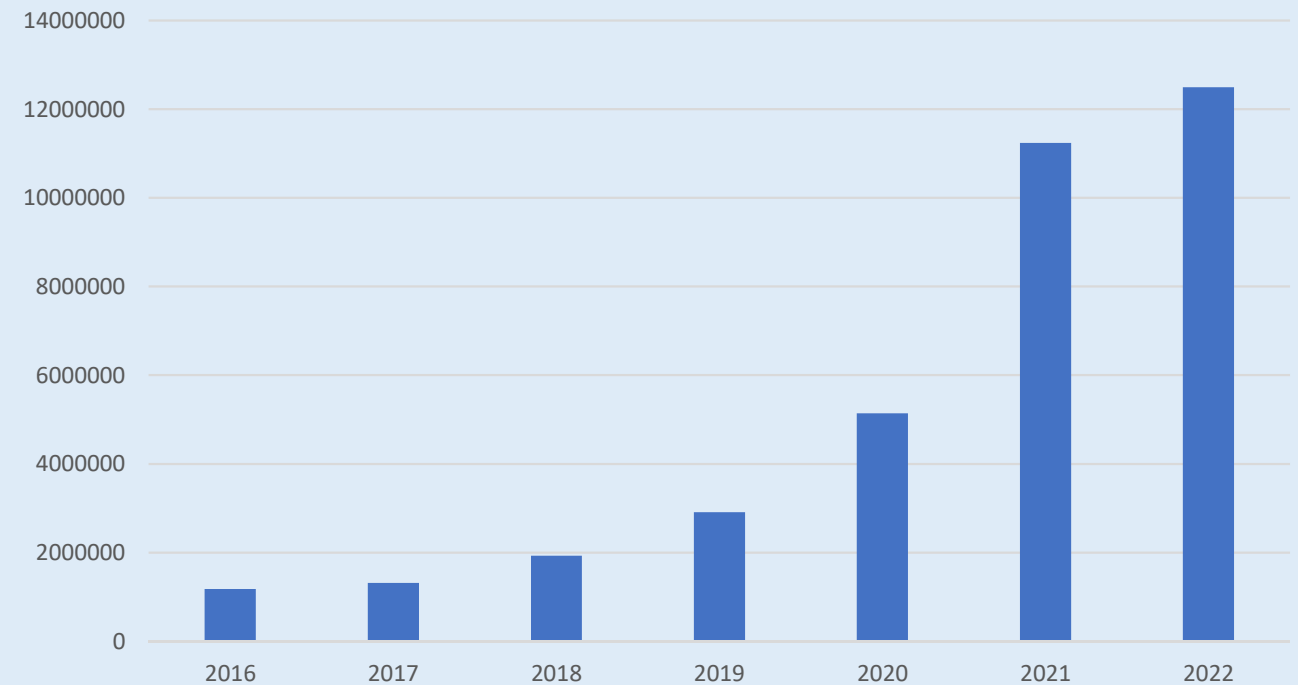

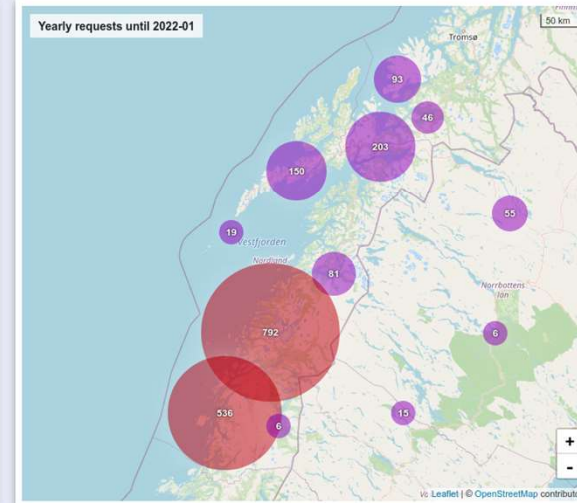
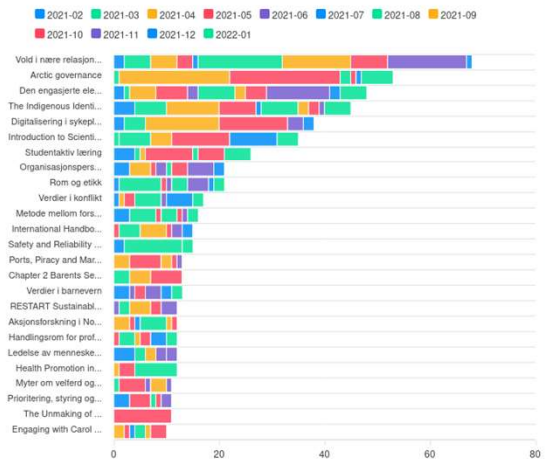
Number of Successful Title Requests per Month and Title for Region (distance 250 km)

The Deposit Service provides an institutional uploading service for researchers and publishers. The OAPEN Library is adapted to the specific demands for academic books, and deploys the metadata standards, classification schemes and distribution channels for academic books.
- Dissemination:** Libraries need to know which openly licensed books are published by
- Discovery:** Making books freely available on the web is only helpful if they are made

The OAPEN Collection

OAPEN hosts several collections:

- SNSF

- (Mostly) Funder based
- Titles published by multiple publishers
- Directly accessible
- Usage in one dashboard

FWF - The Austrian Science Fund

The Austrian Science Fund (German: Fonds zur Förderung der wissenschaftlichen Forschung, FWF) is the most important Austrian funding organization for basic research. The FWF supports research in biomedical sciences, natural sciences, and social sciences, and the humanities through a large variety of grant programmes and prizes.

FWF is part of an Austrian national OAPEN consortium that consists of: Vienna University, Böhlau Verlag, Verlag Holzhausen, the Austrian Academy of Sciences Press, the Academy of Fine Arts Vienna, and the Austrian Science Fund.

FWF requires the deposition of book publications in the FWF E-book Library, from which works are harvested by OAPEN.
