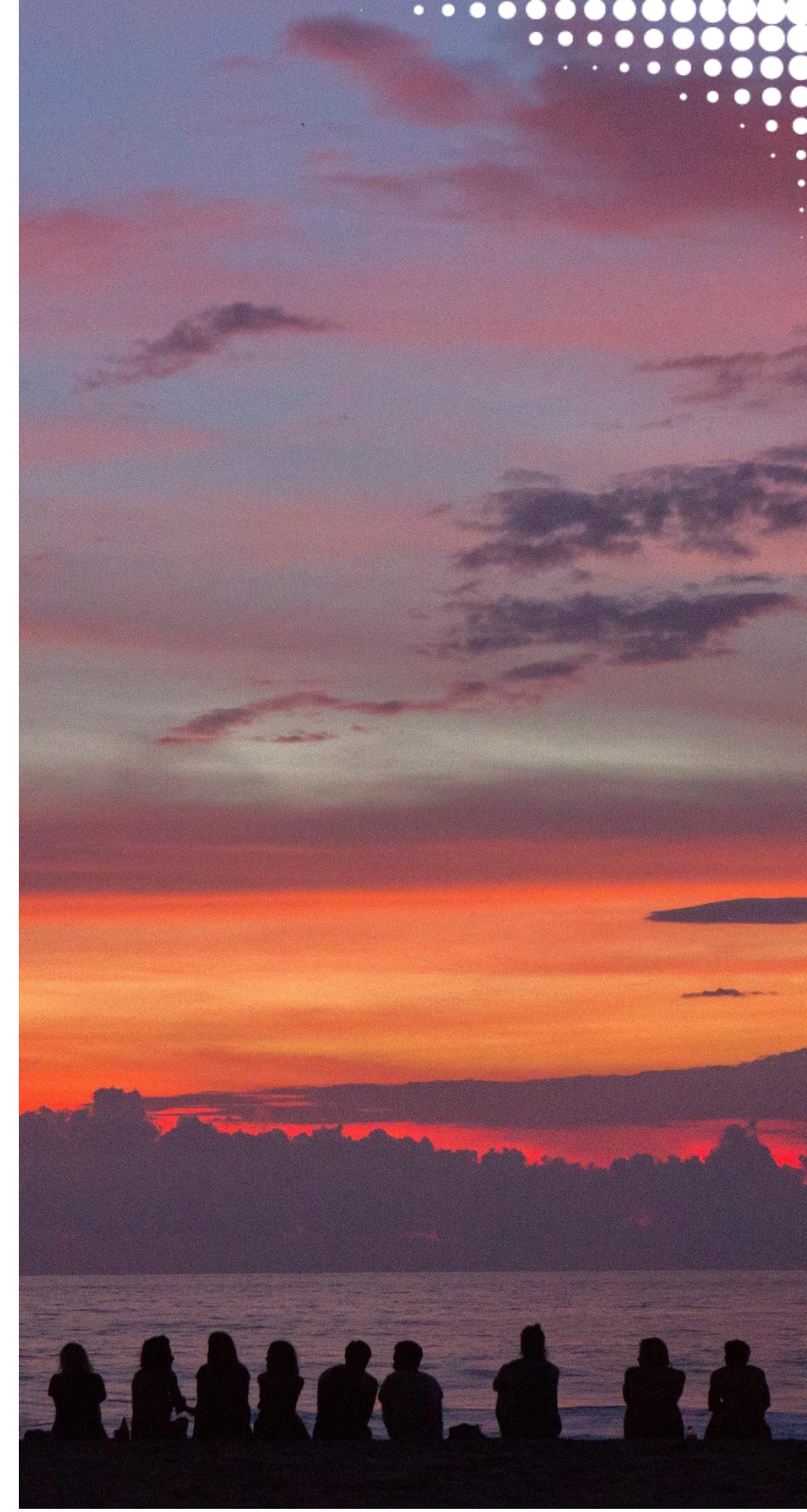


OpenAIRE interoperability metadata guidelines: ensuring a community-driven global governance for the development of the guidelines

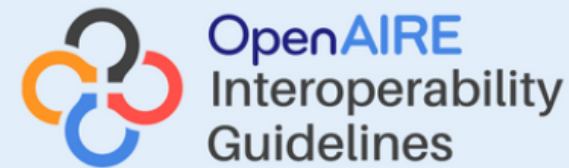
OpenAIRE and EuroCRIS organised a joint webinar focusing on how CRIS systems can be made compliant with OpenAIRE Guidelines as well as on the workflow to register a CRIS system. This webinar targeted national and regional CRIS systems, but CRIS managers may also be interested, since the workflows for CRIS registration are similar. The OAI-PMH endpoint that will allow the CRIS to be harvested by OpenAIRE is common.

It also included brief presentations on the procedures followed and the national-level initiatives who have already managed to become OpenAIRE compliant, such as VIRTA Publication Information Service from Finland and FRIS - Research Information Space from Belgium.

Update the compatibility level of your repository to get onboard the EOSC catalogue

Find out why you should upgrade



If your data source is not yet compatible with the most recent version of the OpenAIRE Guidelines, you should consider updating the compatibility level. Being compatible with the OpenAIRE Guidelines for Literature, institutional, and thematic Repositories 4.0 and 3.0, for Data Archives or for CRIS Managers v1.1, your data source is complying with one of the inclusion criteria to onboard research products in EOSC.

Ensuring the compatibility with the latest versions of the guidelines, you are contributing to improve the interoperability of your data source, as well as to its FAIRness. Meeting the latest IT and repository standards your data source content is more contextualised (links and relationships to other types of research outcomes and entities, such as PIDs), more flexible (different and improved vocabularies), as well as more embedded in the R&I ecosystem (alignment with Open Science mandates and standards and support for well-established metadata schemas, namespace abbreviations).

OpenAIRE is your entry/gateway to EOSC. If you are compatible with the latest versions of the OpenAIRE Guidelines, then you will be onboarding the [EOSC Portal Catalogue and Marketplace integrated platform](#).
