




### Journal Readership 2015–Mar 2017 - Accumulated data since start date








## **Book Project Structure**



## **Common Questions**

- The cost of publishing?
  - GBP 300 per journal article (likely to change in 2018)
  - Approx. GBP 3,250 for a standard book (200 pages, 10 images)
- Who makes decisions?
  - The Publishing Committee, based on recommendations from the editorial boards
- Which subject areas do you cover?
  - All the areas where there's a demand for reasonably priced OA publishing
  - An Editorial Board for the subject area or the journal is also needed
- What dissemination channels do you use?
  - OAPEN for online books
  - Amazon (INT) & Bokinfo (SWE) for Print-on-Demand books
  - Subject area databases & Search Engine Optimisation for journals (takes time to fulfil criteria)
- Stamps of approval? The press is so far approved by DOAJ, the Norwegian Register for Scientific Publishers (Level 1) & The Danish Bibliometric Indicator as a reliable publishing partner.
- What organisations are you members of/contribute to?
  - OASPA, AEUP, ALPSP, OAPEN, DOAJ, Ubiquity Partner Network, CrossRef & COPE (the last two via Ubiquity Press)
