

Over 40% of all topics of Cluster 6 of the Horizon Europe Research and Innovation programme require application of the multi-actor approach. And more are to come!

PREMIERE'S OBJECTIVES

PREMIERE aims to strengthen the multi-actor approach by supporting the development of more relevant, coherent and well-prepared project proposals. This includes all aspects of improving the search for suitable partners, building the project partnership, co-designing the work plan and negotiating an appropriate budget.

A particular focus will be on the involvement of new partner organisations that have not previously been involved in multi-actor projects, including those that have made previous unsuccessful project proposals.



- Multi-actor training through a multi-actor simulation game, an online Serious Game, an Online Academy, and a MOOCas well as offline training-for-trainers
- Divers output such as online videos, creative videos, How-to-Guides etc.
- Recommendations and briefings for the European Commission, their services and external evaluators to help to ensure the implementation of the multiactor approach in new project proposals.
