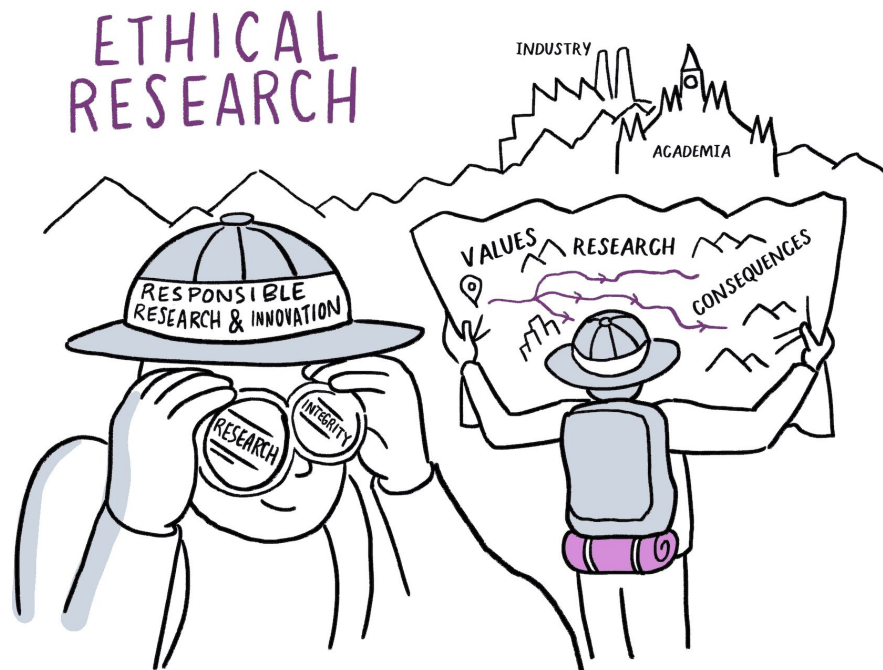

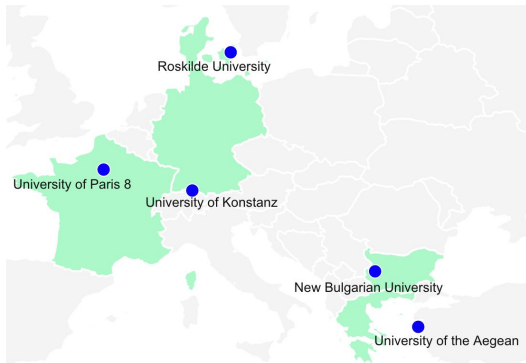

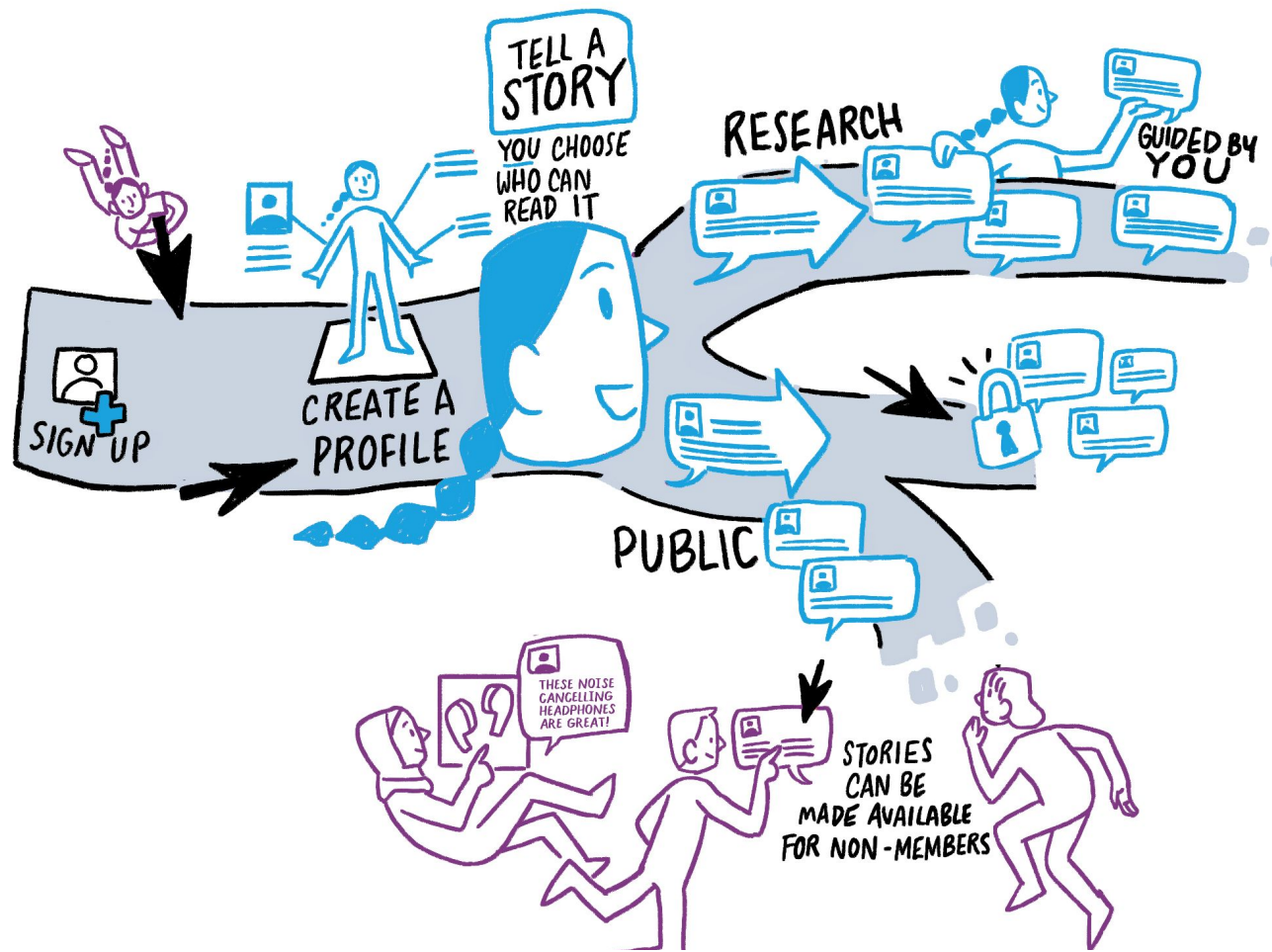

# Intangible Cultural Heritage

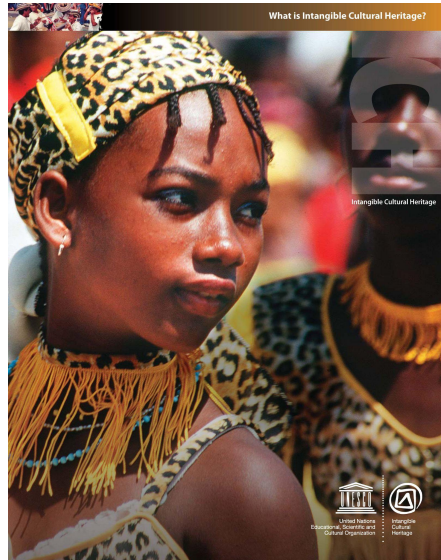
Cultural heritage does not end at monuments and collections of objects. It also includes **traditions or living expressions inherited from our ancestors and passed on, such as**
