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Abstract

1. Framework

Within the WP2 Framework, Task 2.2.4. Comparing models of connected campuses is an initiative organized by UNITA's Teaching & Learning Centers Network (2.2.1) and it represented an initiative of exchanging experiences among teachers from the six universities from the Unita Consortium on the connected campuses concept in the context of an European University Alliance.

2. Preparation and organization of the workshop on Connected Campuses

2.1 Establishing the thematic, the agenda and the contents

The thematic of the workshop's modules were established in the period October 2022 - January 2023 within the meetings of the Teaching & Learning Centers Network. The three days of workshops were set to be organized in 26th-28th of April 2023.

First, the thematics of the modules were split into the main directions on the topic of connected campuses:

- THE PEOPLE - What are the competencies needed by teachers and students in order to activate connected campus model environment?
- TECHNIQUES - Which are the most suitable pedagogic methodologies to be used in a connected campus model environment?
- TECHNOLOGIES - What are the technologies and the devices that can facilitate teaching and learning in a connected campus model environment?

According to these three main directions, a call for proposals of modules was launched within the Unita Teaching & Learning Centers Network community. After collecting all the proposals, the organizers (representatives of UPPA and UVT) finalized the agenda (table 1).

During the promotion period, 33 teachers registered for participation to the workshop.

The preparation of the modules content was organized within a common effort of the members of the Teaching & Learning Centers Network, 17 experts from the UNITA universities creating content of the modules.

2.3 Organization of the Workshop modules on Connected Campuses:

The three workshops' days offered for the whole community were organized face-to-face, being hosted by the University of Pau (UPPA).

-4 modules organized and a conclusions session

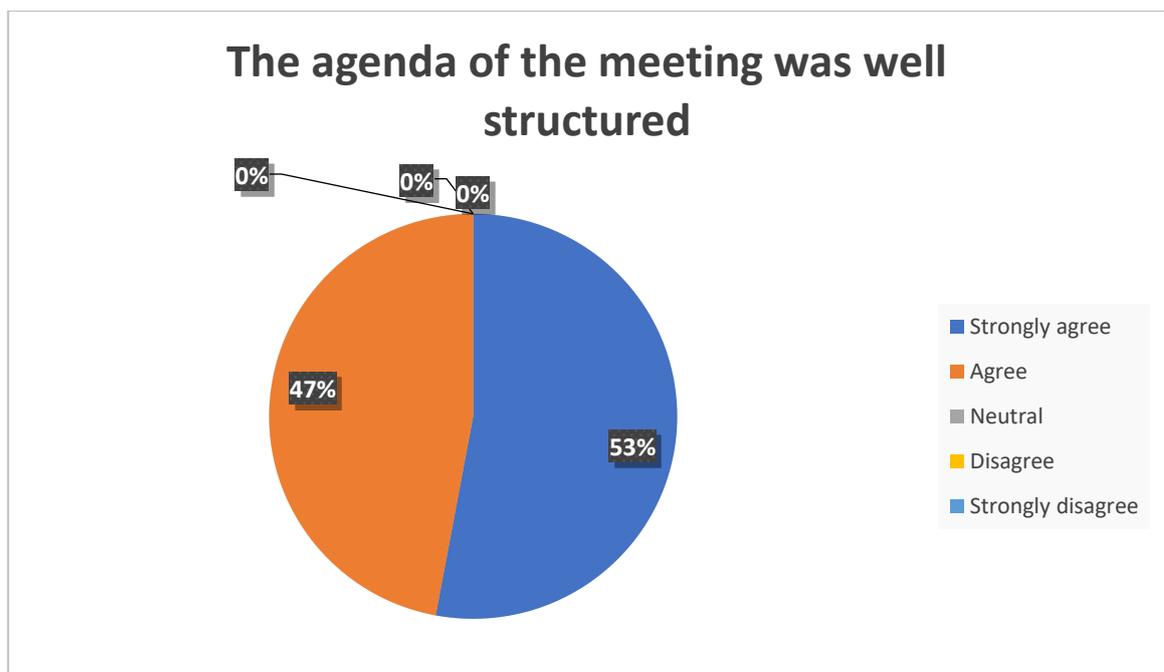
-18 participants in the three day.

2.4 Feedback from the participants

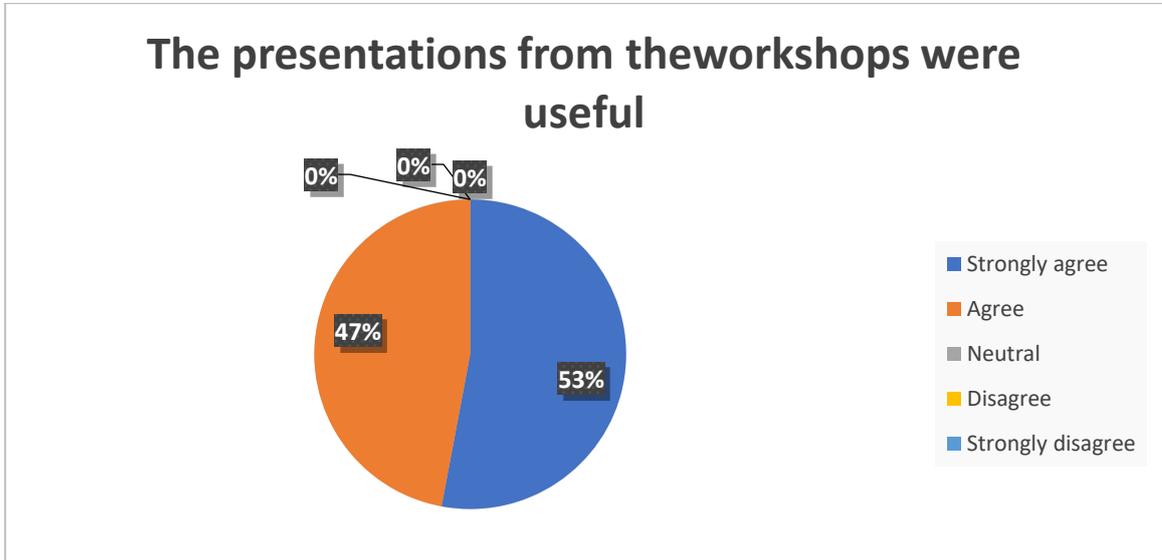
At the end of the Workshops, a feedback form was sent to the participants. The results from the feedback are presented in the tables 2-8

Table 2 - Feedback on planning and organization



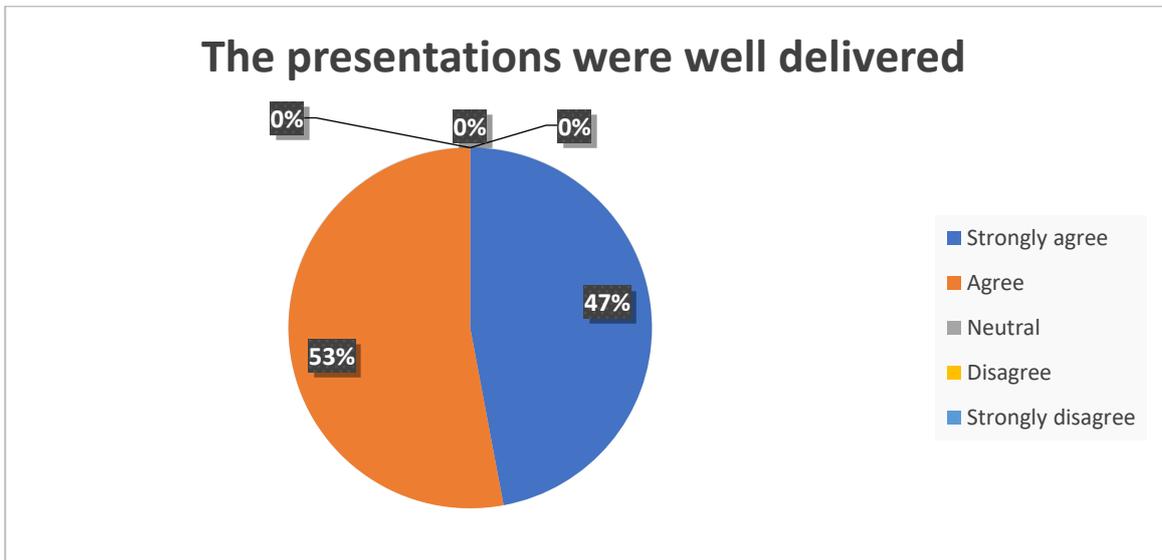
All of the participants consider the workshops well planned and organized (96%).

Table 3 - Feedback on usefulness of the presentations



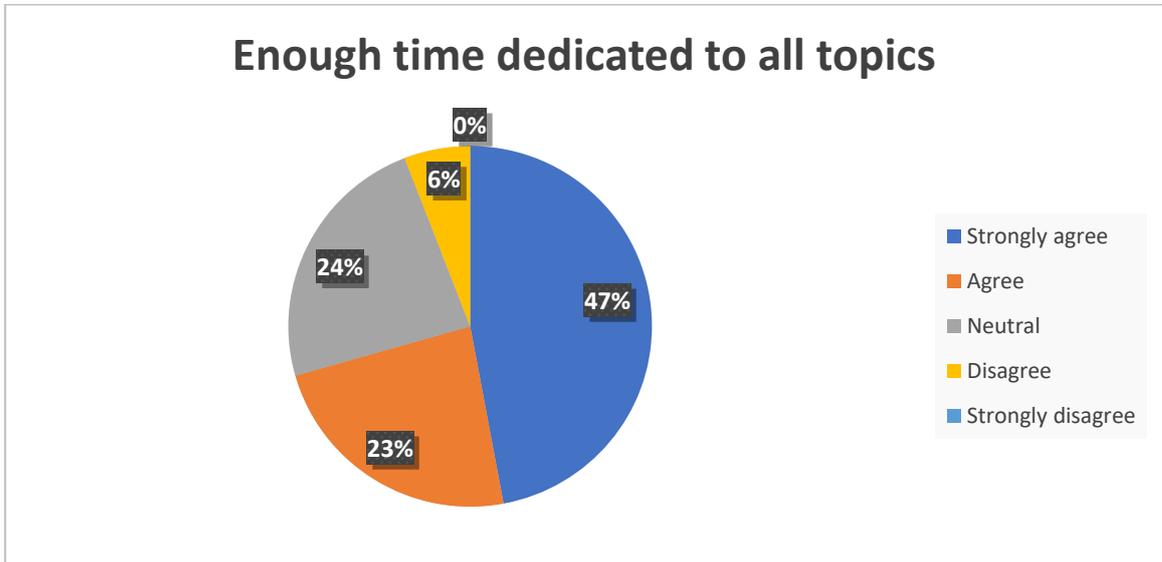
The usefulness of the presentations was also evaluated positively by all of the participants (100%).

Table 4 - Feedback on the delivery of the presentations



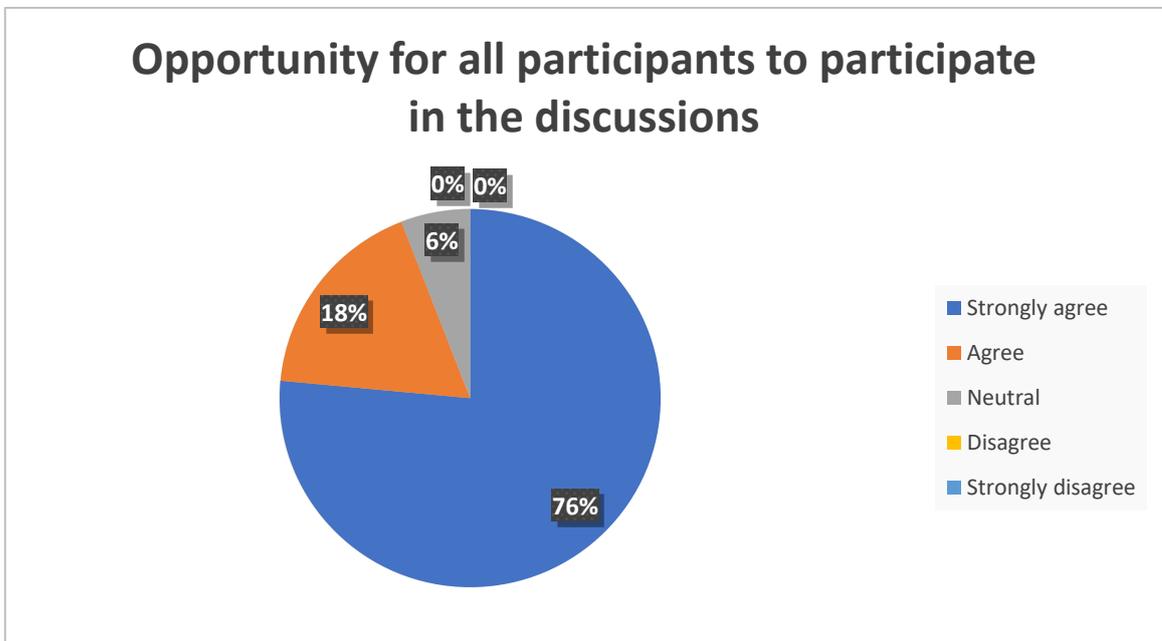
100% of the participants considered that the presentations were well delivered within the workshops.

Table 5 - Feedback on the time management of the workshops



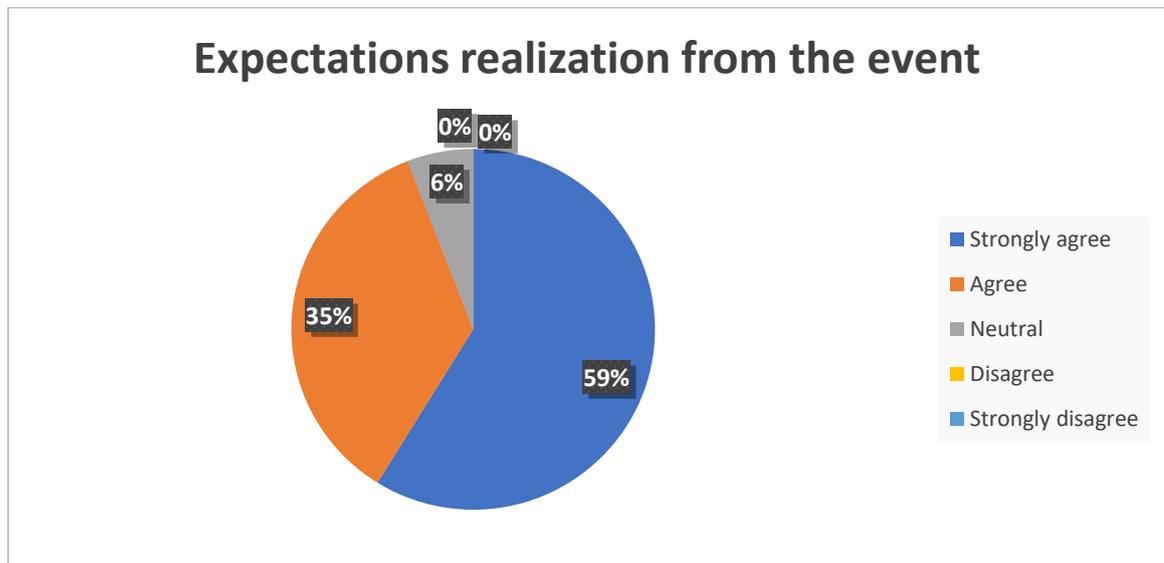
69% of the participants appreciate the time management within the workshops schedule.

Table 6 - Feedback on the possibility of discussions within the workshops



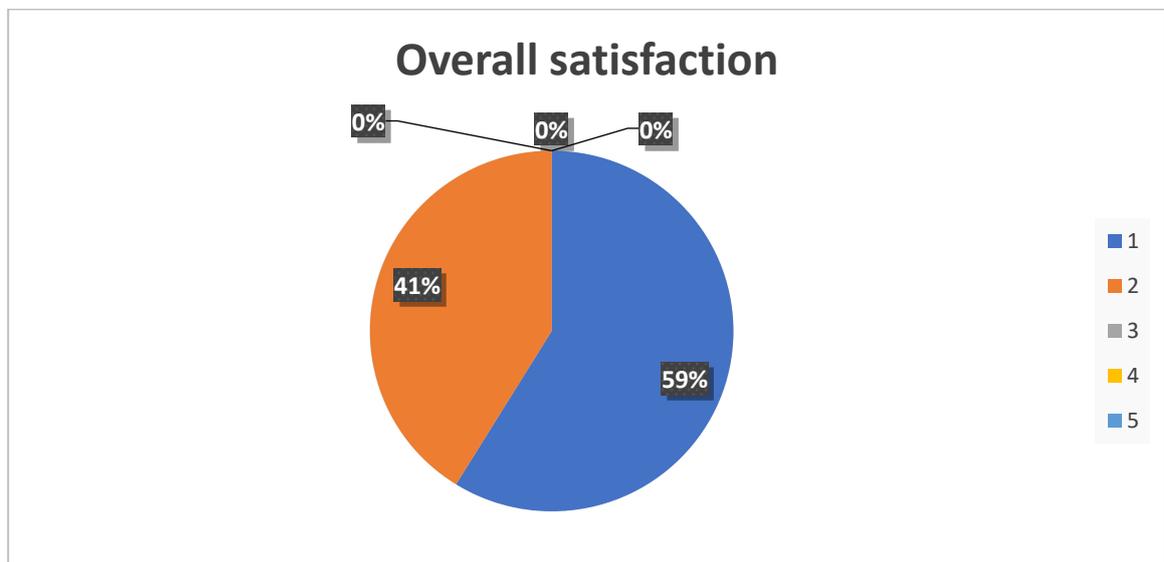
The opportunity to participate to the discussions was also positively appreciated by 94% of the participants.

The personal expectations of the participants were also met in a high percentage - 94% of the feedback.

The overall evaluation of the participants show a mean of 4.58 (out of 5).

Most of the participants when asked what their main benefit was from attending to the workshops recognised the importance of experience sharing with colleagues from other universities, many of

the participants noticing the common challenges and the different approaches to face those challenges.

3. Further development

The Teaching & Learning Centers Network will continue to develop training modules on Connected Campuses and other specific topics, that will be delivered to the academic community of the Unita Consortium.

4. Evaluation of the results

Within deliverable 2.2.4 - Comparing models of connected campuses, the workshop constituted an important place of good practices sharing for the UNITA's academic community. A variety of important topics referring to the conceptualization of the Unita Connected Campuses were presented and debated, having the potential to produce positive changes within all partner universities and support the various complex aspects involved in creating a functional educational process in an European context.
