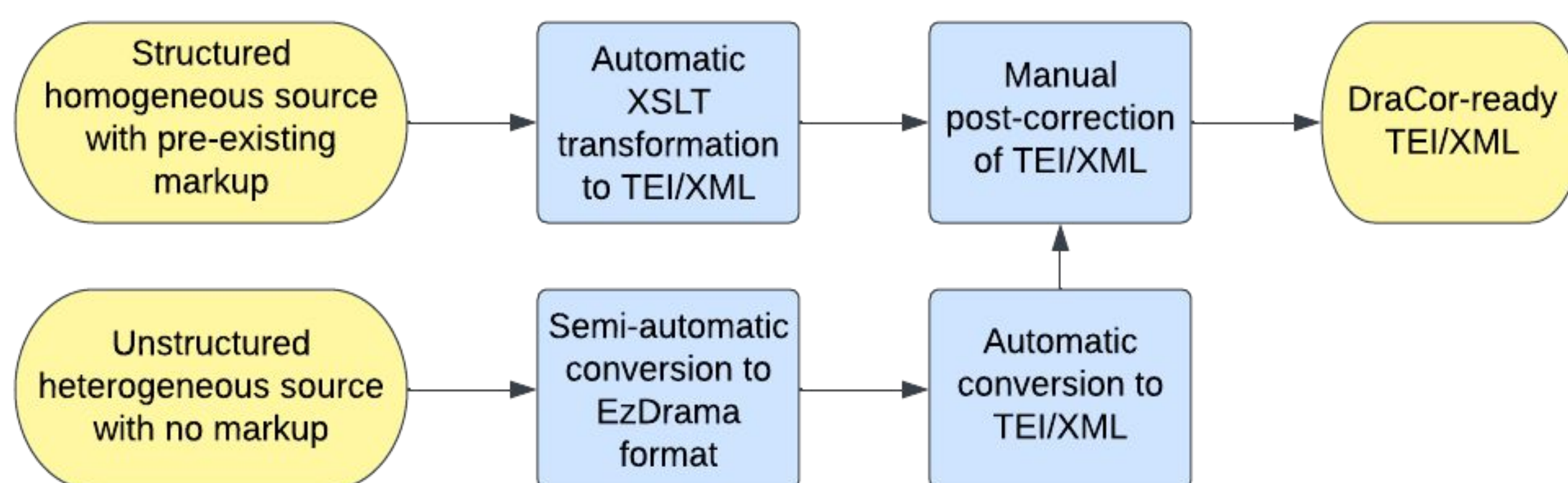


# Distributed Corpus Building in Literary Studies: The DraCor Example

- ❖ **DraCor**: an open platform and a network of resources for hosting, accessing, and analysing theatre plays.
- ❖ 15 “programmable corpora” in 10 languages, about **3000 works**, all encoded in **TEI-XML**
- ❖ Ships with tools for quantitative analysis, API endpoints, Linked Open Data and much more!
