

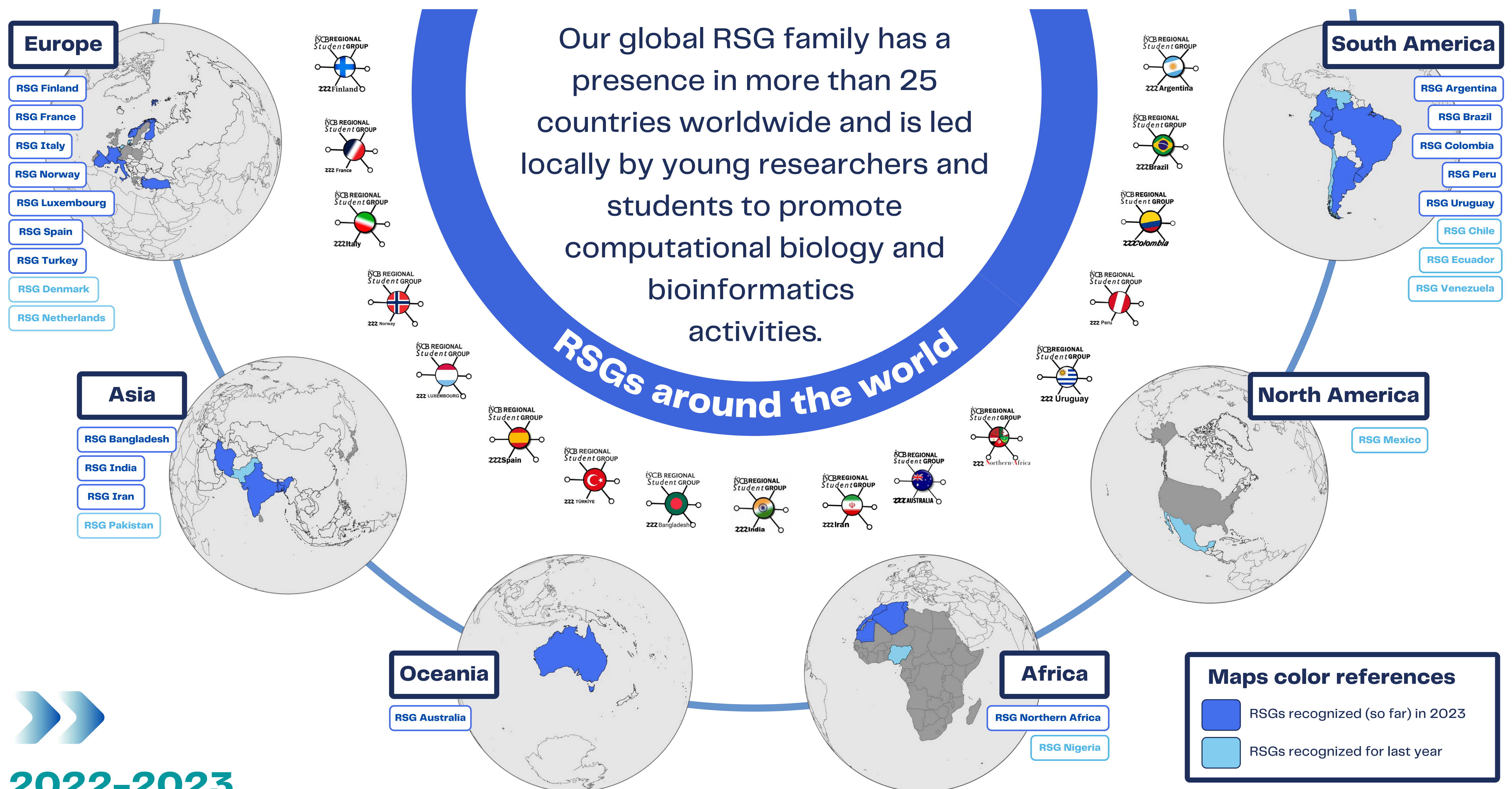


ISCB Student Council Regional Student Groups: Connecting young computational biologists around the Globe

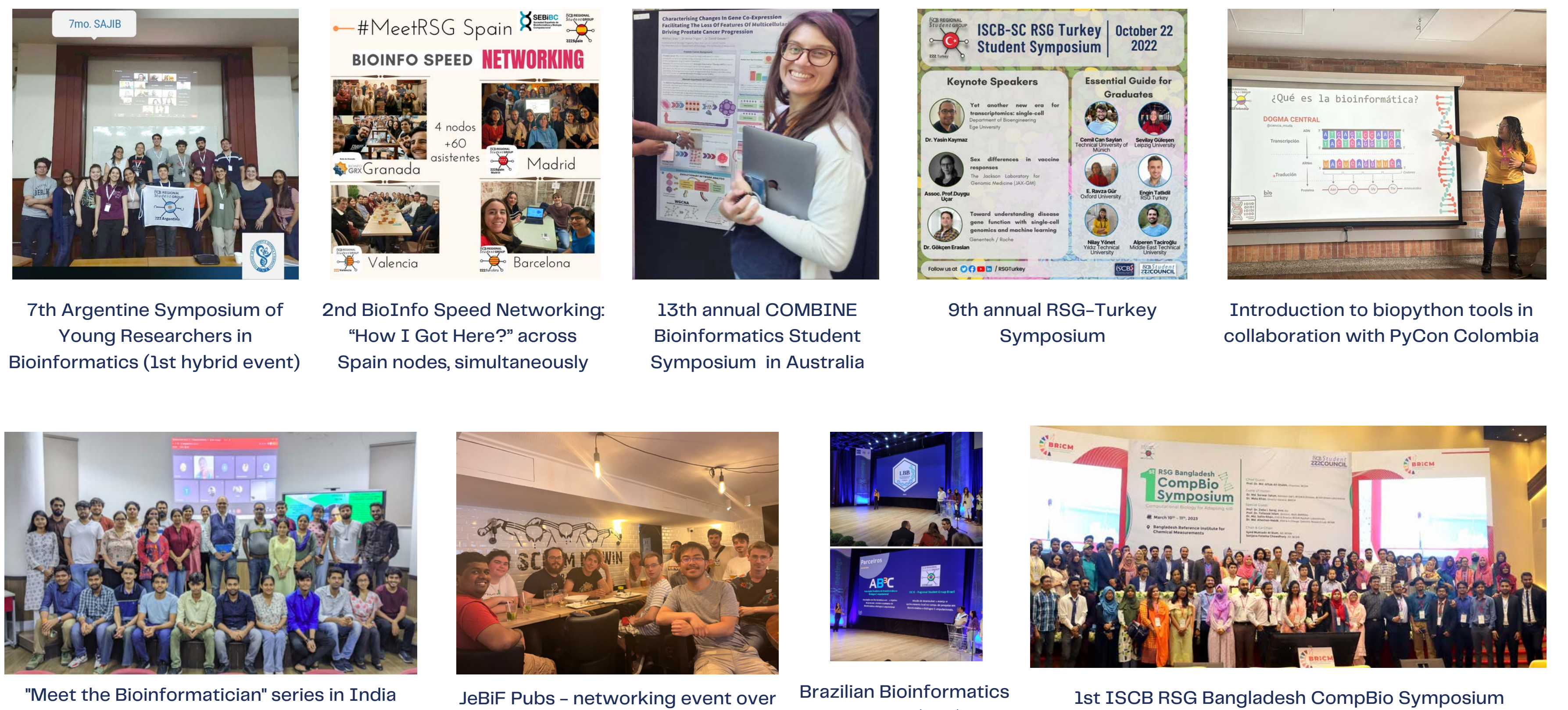
