WHAT:

to realise a FAIR EOSC by supporting the implementation of FAIR-enabling practices across scientific communities and research outputs at a European, national, and institutional level;

HOW:

- identifying current and emerging components for enabling FAIR (practices, policies, tools & technical specifications);
- translating viable solutions, guidelines and frameworks that have been developed for one domain or research output and supporting their application in others;
- taking the next step in implementation by defining the support, governance, and coordination mechanisms required to ensure the continuous function of FAIR-enabling practices in the EOSC.

- 3 support routes
 - Route 1: via dedicated guidance and one-to-one support
 - Route 2: via support to test specific tools, approaches and solutions
 - Via our series of public FAIR Implementation workshops

What FAIR-IMPACT will provide

- In this programme, no financial support is provided but participants will receive dedicated support including expert guidance and advice from FAIR-IMPACT mentors and external experts
- Practical advice and guidance on key FAIR-enabling topics. The support programmes for each stakeholder group will vary but thematic areas covered may
 include policies, persistent identifiers, data management planning, trustworthy repositories, provision of support and training, and handling other research
 outputs including software.
- One-to-one support to:
 - Undertake a supported self-assessment of current FAIR-enabling practices
 - Develop a FAIR implementation action plan
 - Devise an engagement strategy
- A key aim of the support programme is to foster knowledge exchange between peers and there will be dedicated workshops to facilitate this
- The opportunity to promote their work via a published FAIR Implementation Story.

 - One to one support to carry out a self assessment, develop action plan and devise an engagement strategy

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Indication of estimated effort required from participants

About 45 hours of effort to:

- attend all the webinars
- create a FAIR national implementation plan
- benefit from dedicated support by t2.5 partners
- participate to the peer-knowledge exchange workshop
- prepare the engagement and dissemination plan
- answer to the interview and follow-up questionnaire

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What is expected of participants

- Willingness to participate in the required workshops and/or meetings that will be outlined in the specific support programme. All workshops, events and meetings will be held virtually.
- Willingness to carry out the assigned homework in between the virtual workshops. One-to-one support will be provided to assist with and assess homework.
- Willingness to act on the FAIR implementation action plan that will be co-developed with mentors.
- Ability to engage relevant local or national actors to enable the implementation of the action plan.
- Willingness to participate in an exit interview within a month after the end of the support programme which will be used to draft a FAIR Implementation Story.
- Willingness to participate in periodic follow-up questionnaires and/or interviews.



Who can apply?

This call is open to individuals, groups and organisations from public and private research-performing organisations, including:

- Research-performing organisations and research infrastructures
- Repositories, data and metadata service providers
- Representatives of national and international level initiatives

Applicants must reside and/or work in an EU or Associated Country for the duration of the support programme.







How to Apply

You will be asked to login on the FAIR-IMPACT website first!




The TRUST-GRANTSTM platform dashboard home





The application form

- Will be completed entirely online on the TRUST-Grants platform
- Choose the support programme you want to apply from the homepage
- Fill out the form. You can save your application as a DRAFT and return to it
- Remember to complete your application and SUBMIT it by the deadline!
- The evaluation of your applications will be carried out in the TRUST-Grants platform by 3 different evaluators who will assess the application individually and then reach a consensus view



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What are we looking for in applications?

- National role of the organisation and/or potential impact at a national level
- Relations with its ministry and policy-makers?
- Mandated Organisation of EOSC-A? Or connection with the mandated organisation?
- Ability to disseminate the FAIR implementation plan at a national level?
- Ability to have the FAIR implementation plan approved at a national level?
- Ability to have concrete engagement from researchers at a national level?



Follow-up requested activities

Exit interview

Consent to participation in an exit interview and understand that this will form the basis of a FAIR Implementation Story.

Follow up communication

Consent to completing a short follow-up questionnaire 6-12 months after my participation to help FAIR-IMPACT gauge the impact of the support actions.
