One day I was doing lunch in banqueting room in Brunswick campus, RMIT University. It was the primary moment of my PhD schooling. I had a black color tie in my neck, made in Bangladesh. A lady professor was using laptop in another table. She was wearing t-shirt (possibly black color/white color) and long trouser/pant. She said to me “the tie is our culture/tie is our”. I was just hearing the voice of lady professor. One day she called me in dining room and I introduced with her. I cannot remember the name of lady professor. I usually wear tie and good dress for good feeling and doing good for quality office work from morning to evening in family office and professional office. Religious people also wears tie for assembly to their religious centre. It is necessary to standardize dress code if professors have good looking ‘ego’ of student. There is also a matter of female dress standardization under good covering fashion and textiles for practicing of civilization from primary schooling to PhD schooling all over the world. In university level, there is a present practice of freedom for personal choosing of dress code all over the world. It may have exception but I do not know.

Dr. Md. Abdur Rahman in RMIT PhD school, presently professor of Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology (DUET) had a dress code of casual tops and long pants in PhD school. Maximum time, he had casual dress. I usually used winter blazer in RMIT PhD school. I had two blazers. One blazer was old, stitching cost and fabric cost was around 40AUD, made in Bangladesh and another blazer was almost new, stitching cost and fabric was around 50AUD, made in Bangladesh. Dr Abdur Rahman had a casual complain about me to avoid blazer in RMIT PhD school. I didn’t get any show cause notice from RMIT PhD school due to dress code violence. I didn’t get any specific dress code notice from RMIT PhD school as per Australian Quality of Research Framework. It seems that it was the personal norms of Dr Abdur Rahman in RMIT PhD

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school and told to colleague researcher in PhD school from his personal 'ego'. I visited DUET campus, two times. I saw that professors were wearing shirts/blazer and long pants. One day, I met with Professor Dr. Md. Abdus Shahid, DUET. I saw him with shirts and long pants. Another day, I met with Dr. Md. Abdullahil Kafi, DUET. I asked a suggestion about my life-threatening in Australia who told me, "You may discuss with student service department of your university". I saw him with shirts and long pants. I had seen so many people in DUET campus who had good looking dress. In Bangladesh; primary school students, primary school teachers, high school students, high school teachers, college teachers, college students, university teachers and university students are also using good looking dress like shirt, pant, blazer and tie. Farmers are also using shirt and pant if they need. Therefore, there is a matter of dress code standardization globally in different profession but eliminating personal ego may solve the issue of dress & code in a same place, in a same vessel. For example of standardization, a PhD school cannot provide different dress code for different PhD student. A PhD school cannot provide different dress code for different academic background. A PhD school cannot provide different dress code for different professional background. Undoubtedly, a professor/student can wear good dress both in home country and foreign country, both in teaching and learning environment in PhD school.

Dr. Md. Abdur Rahman told me in his casual discussion, "You are not so much big" (my height around 5 feet, 2 inch and weight around 55Kg).

Dr. Md. Abdur Rahman told me in his casual discussion, "You may write about Melbourne, we will read your literature/writing". I have written something about PhD school in Melbourne.

Dr. Md. Abdur Rahman told me, "as you have PhD scholarship, you will get PhD degree".

Dr. Abu Shaïd told me, "can you give me the PhD thesis of Dr. Abdus Shahid, DUET? can you collect? I want to see one time".

Dr. Abu Shaïd expressed the attitude, "he was not happy for the PhD of Dr. Md. Abdur Rahman"

Dr. Abu Shaïd told me, "as you have PhD scholarship, you will get PhD degree".

Dr. Abu Shaïd told me, "you are only good, nobody is good"

Dr. Abu Shaïd told me when I had no medical problem when I had no PhD suspension/scholarship suspension (2021), "if you go for medical leave/psychologist treatment, you will get full scholarship for long time".

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Dr. Abu Shaid, Bangladeshi national (presently primary school teacher in Melbourne, Australia) saluted (hand showing and leg movement) me casually in PhD school. I do not know if administration of RMIT University guided him to do accordingly. He also felt that Anowar was looking by exceptional in RMIT PhD school. He called me 'Anowar Vi (Brother)' although he is senior than me. 'Vi' is a Bengali language and English meaning is brother. Dr. Abu Shaid was wearing Panjabi and long trouser in RMIT University. It was a very religious dress in Australia. One day I saw him with casual dress in RMIT PhD school. It was the combination of long jeans/trouser and shirt.

Dr. Saiful Islam, Assistant Professor, Head of the Department, City University told me (2018-2019), "it was supposed to get promotion of all faculty members by Anowar's manuscript/publication". I heard the voice by chance. Dr. Saiful Islam told me (2018-2019), "Can we see textile engineering infrastructure of Calcutta University". Dr. Saiful Islam told me after getting Australian Government RTP stipend scholarship (2020), "can we do some of PhD works on behalf of Engr. Anowar Hossain". I heard the voices by chance. Dr. Saiful Islam told me, "you will join City University after completion of your PhD. Dr. Saiful has the expertise in textile wet processing technology. He is my BSc schooling professor in wet processing technology-3. I had below communication with Dr. Saiful Islam. Possibly it was an Eid day in Australia.

Dr. Saiful Islam told me in front of a freedom fighter, "His (Anowar) performance is the best than all the teachers in my department".

I saw that professors were wearing t-shirt/polo shirt in an official teaching environment. Usually, students follow professors; so, it should not be standardized that every student should follow professor's dress code and wear t-shirt/polo shirt in an official learning environment. I motivate my student for wearing good looking dress. I feel good when my students are looking good. I feel privilege when my students are looking good. I feel good when my students are doing good. I keep a small unit of mark for wearing good dress during class performance, class presentation and viva examination under a standardized schooling system in City university, Dhaka, Bangladesh. During my undergraduate schooling in City University, Bangladesh, professors motivated me in official class room in an official learning environment to wear good dress. One

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day, I had a viva examination for a job. I had a good-looking tie in my neck with a formal dress (long sleeve shirt and long pants), a good-looking dress (price was not so much higher). Same day, I had a teaching duty in City University. I came to City University without changing my dress. Teaching faculty of City University had no dress code directed by administration. A professor (Dr.) named AKM Saiful Islam was walking beside my office desk and commented me. He told me when I had MTech Degree from Calcutta University, when I was a designated lecturer of City University when I had MTech Degree from University of Calcutta when I was a designated lecturer (Textile Engineering) of City University, Dhaka “is it the learning of Calcutta University relates to dress code”. Dr. AKM Saiful Islam was not happy to see tie in my neck and possibly for wearing a good-looking official dress. I was so much silent. I was thinking again and again. I didn’t get any permanent solution to satisfy my professor regarding dress code, but I didn’t use tie in City University. Possibly I used tie casually. I regularly wore shirt and long pants. I kept bottom part of shirt inside of pant. My professor named Dr. AKM Saiful Islam had a dress code of jeans, polo-shirt and sometimes long pants and shirt. Dr. AKM Saiful Islam usually had a casual dress. Should I follow him exactly? I didn’t see him wearing neck tie for a single day. So, what should be the solution? There is no solution if it is a matter of personal ‘ego’ of a professor. I didn’t get any show cause notice for dress code from City university administration for wearing dress of long sleeve shirt and long pants (keeping bottom part of shirt inside of pant) during four years duration academic schooling and professional schooling since 22 August 2017. Dr. Saiful Islam was little bit worried about my family, but I didn’t discuss anything about my family with him. After coming from Australia (2022), I verbally reported him in my casual discussion about my family, “I didn’t bring my wife to city University, Bangladesh and I didn’t bring my wife to RMIT University, Australia”. In 2022, Dr. AKM Saiful told me, “Do you have communication with your PhD supervisor in Australia”(Hossain, 2023az, 2023ba, 2023bb, 2023bc). In 2018, Dr. AKM Saiful Islam told me after marriage “nobody should/can pressure Anowar, he is the decision maker about his marriage”, I heard this voice by chance. Practically I do not like to twist my family office and professional office from my early career of my engineering profession. I saw the dress code of Pro Vice Chancellor (2017-2020), Vice Chancellor, Professor Dr. Shahe-Alom (2019-2020), Former Vice Chancellor (Professor Dr. Borhanuddin), City University. They had good looking dress code of shirt and pant. They kept bottom part of shirt inside of pant. There are few key points of Government Universities versus Private universities for development of quality education in Bangladesh. This may also be applicable for international platform.

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- ✓ Government can budget a minimum percentage of cost for private universities based on performance, whatever way public universities are getting budget based on research/education performance/other financing policy of a country.
- ✓ There is no way to close any university, pass-out student may feel frustration to establish their social and professional value in home and abroad. If private universities have involvement any crime subversive of private university law, these universities should be stopped, but university grant commission may have a tendency to focus in news-media rather than direct establishing their administrative weapon. Admitted /pass out student should not have liability when university can administer their schooling activities. There is no responsibility of present student/former student to carry out the blame of private universities to establish as a professional body in home and abroad. It should be controlled by the concern officials, otherwise identified university should be controlled by government concern. "There is no way to stop a university when it is being approved by the government". "There is no way to threaten a university for stopping through newspaper when it is being approved by the government", it may be psychological harm to present/former student to establish in their profession. Hence the private universities act should be modified accordingly.
- ✓ Private university teacher should have active participation in related government appointment and/or Bangladesh Public Service Commission. I am looking so many reputed/qualified professors are working in private universities.
- ✓ Private universities are not getting fund from government when private universities are also contributing for the development of whole country. Hence a minimum fund can be sanctioned for private universities at least equivalent to one public university of whole Bangladesh/country in initial stage.
- ✓ Under government payment, minimum one PhD graded professor can be appointed by the University Grants Commission (UGC) for every department of private universities.
- ✓ UGC should pass a law to write specific name of university rather than mentioning name as whole term of private university/public university. For example: Dhaka university cannot take any responsibility for the academic crime of Chittagong University/City University and nobody can mention accordingly. The word/term of private university/public University should not be written in general.
- ✓ There is still lacking of clarity of promotion policy both in public and private universities referred to UGC web-side.
- ✓ There is also lacking of clarity of promotion policy who got PhD referred to web-side.

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- ✓ There is also lacking of clarity of higher education funding/PhD funding in private universities referred to UGC web-side. PhD funding policy of private universities should be controlled by UGC. For example, I got scholarship from Australia to pursue PhD in RMIT University, but I didn't get funding from City University, Bangladesh under approved study leave from the office of honorable Vice Chancellor.
- ✓ There are public universities in Bangladesh are using huge 'land area' for teaching and learning when private universities are being threatened to stop without having permanent campus but the principle of expectation of government is almost same from public and private universities. When private universities are struggling for education contribution, government can arrange land under different condition, in a way that university cannot be stopped for education service.
- ✓ Studentship in foreign country versus permanent residency (PR) in Australia/Kanada/USA/Other developed countries is a challenging fact for the right development of Bangladesh/poor countries all over the world. Higher educated persons are being addicted for PR in developed countries. But the right purposes and right reasons may not be correct for all cases, may not be satisfying the right dream of a higher educated person.
- ✓ Quality education has no relationship based on the name of country, there is a matter of quality professor and quality infrastructure. The education cost of studying in developed country is so much expensive if the tuition cost is compared with the private/public universities in Bangladesh/poor/developing countries. The guardians of Bangladeshi students are paying higher in foreign country and spending Bangladeshi currency. Government should make limitation when students are studying in foreign country under self-funding. If it can be controlled for going to foreign country and monitored private/public universities by the specialized academician; private universities should be reputed than public universities in Bangladesh. More foreign students can be attracted and there is possibility of huge foreign earnings for the growth of nations of poor/developing.

Professor Dr. Shahe-Alom told a story in research grant meeting, City University, Dhaka, Bangladesh "A person telephoned to a professor for getting a job. After getting job, the person asked for letter for doing/executing specific job of a professor in his department". Professor Dr. Shahe-Alom, Former Vice Chancellor, City University told (2018/2019) me "the PhD of Jahangirnagar University is not good". He told me "I throwed one PhD thesis of Jahangirnagar

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University”. Professor Dr. Shahe-Alom commented my research proposal and forwarded me to Professor Dr. Mihir Kumar, City University who read my research proposal and edited for research grant from research cell, City University. The dress code of Professor Dr. Mihir Kumar was shirt, pant and tie. Professor Dr. Shahe-Alom was happy when I got PhD scholarship to pursue PhD in RMIT University. He helped me for immediate issue of ‘study leave letter’ when I got Australian Student Visa. Professor Dr. Shahe-Alom ordered to Registrar, “we will give him everything whatever he needs”. Dr. Shahe-Alom worked for salary upgradation of City University, still the teacher’s facilities are lower than public Universities. Administrative works, answer script evaluations, exam committee works are the non-paid job. Dr. Shahe-Alom was wearing shirt and pant. He always kept bottom part of shirt inside of pant.

Female dress combination in Bangladesh is salwar, kameez and orna although shari is a traditional dress in Bangladesh. Orna is long around 90 inch. Bangladeshi female usually covers head and chest by orna. Some female covers only chest. Some female covers both head and chest. Muslim religious people like to cover both head and chest. One day I faced an embarrassing issue in my teaching profession. I had a lunch with Engr. Shikha, a lab instructor in City University Campus. There was a dining corner for teachers inside of Textile Engineering Department. By profession, lady teacher was junior than me. We passed BSc engineering from same university. She wore same dress/same color dress again and again, a Bangladeshi dress combination with salwar, kameez and orna. I eagerly asked her “why do you like to wear same dress again and again when I had a friendly official relation and discussion with her”? She was so much angry and verbally complained to the Head of the Department named Dr. AKM Saiful Islam, directed by Engr. Md. Arifuzzaman, assistant professor of same department. Dr. AKM Saiful Islam just told me “what is hearing, you can go to library and read and read, there is also book in library”. I had a dress code of blue shirt/white shirt with long pants. I had two shirts with same color. Sometimes, my student asked me “why do you like to wear white shirt/same color shirt every day. I didn’t feel/show angry”. Later Engr. Shikha told me, “can you tell us everything that how to get scholarship”.

One of my BSc schooling friend, Engr. Mizan, presently deputy manager/manager of textile industry told me (2007) “you look like professor (Dr.)”, frequently he joked and told me, “Professor (Dr.) Anowar”. Engr. Mizan had a good-looking dress like shirt, pant, t-shirt and polo

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shirts. Similarly, so many BSc schooling friend joked and told me Dr. Anwar. They had dress code of shirt and pant in BSc schooling.

Engr. Shariful Islam, Lecturer, City University e-mailed me (2020-2021), “send me four FTIR spectra for my manuscript support”. Engr. Shariful Islam told me (2019) when we were dealing with IEB-BAETE (Institute of Engineers, Bangladesh-board of accreditation for engineering and technical education), Accreditation of Department of Textile Engineering, “can you manage a lady for my marriage, my wife is not staying with me”. Engr. Shariful Islam wears shirt and pant regularly. He also wears blazer for his teaching duty in City University. He kept bottom part of shirt inside of pant. I had below communication with Engr. Shariful Islam.

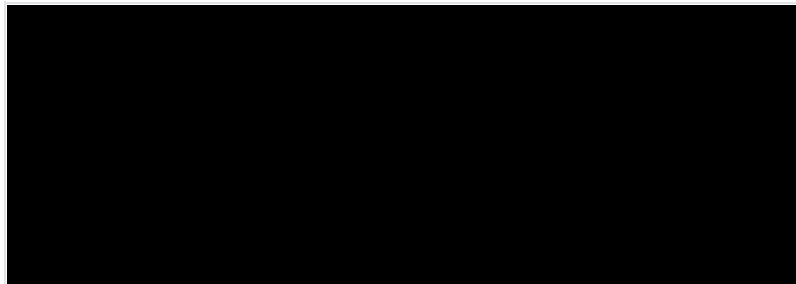

Abu Baker Siddique, Manager, Niagara Textiles Ltd., Chandra Circle, Kaliakair, Gazipur, Bangladesh told (2009) me “you can work as helper, dyeing & finishing” it was a demotivation of a textile engineer having degree of BSc in Textile Engineering. Textile engineer usually works as officer in textile industry. For example, a trainee doctor in hospital works very close with a medical officer in Bangladesh and India; but a trainee textile engineer cannot work very close with an executive engineer in textile industry in Bangladesh.

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Senior Engr. Md. Abu Baker Siddique, Manager, Niagara Textiles Ltd., Chandra Circle, Kaliakair, Gazipur, Bangladesh commented me indirectly (2009) “you are looking good in his religious speech in textile dyeing laboratory”. Engr. Md. Abu Baker Siddique also telephoned me and told me “do not marry a female of rich family”. I followed his direction, still there is problem. He was wearing shirts and long trouser (without keeping bottom part of shirt inside of pants). Senior Engr. Pabitra, Manager, Niagara Textiles Ltd., Chandra Circle, Kaliakair, Gazipur, Bangladesh told me when I had a BSc engineering degree from city University, “you can get a bachelor degree from Bangabandhu college in Chandra, Gazipur instead of City University”. Textile engineer usually works as officer in textile industry. Engr. Pabitra, Manager, Niagara Textiles Ltd. also told (2009-2010) me “you can work as helper, dyeing & finishing” it was a demotivation of a textile engineer. Engr. Pabitra, Manager, Niagara Textiles Ltd. told me in terms of my small hair style and/or life style (possibly) “You look like President Barak Obama, Nobel winner”. Engr. Pabitra told me, “you are not looking good when you lough”. One day Engr. Pabitra also meet with me in Calcutta, India and Jessore, Bangladesh. He always calls me Dr. Anowar. He introduced with his wife by saying Dr. Anowar. Engr. Pabitra was not happy with my MTech Degree. He negatively commented about my MTech thesis without looking and reading it(Hossain, 2015a, 2015b; Samanta et al., 2016). Engr. Pabitra, Manager, Niagara Textiles Ltd. was wearing shirts and long trouser (keeping bottom part of shirt inside of pants). He always had a good-looking dress and smiling face. Engr. Arif supervised my training in Niagara Textiles Ltd. Engr. Arif, Niagara Textiles Ltd., Chandra Circle, Kaliakair, Gazipur, Bangladesh told me in a telephonic conversation when I was studying MTech, University of Calcutta, “we are sorry for saying rubbish on behalf of whole team of dyeing and finishing, Niagara Textiles Ltd”. Engr. Arif was wearing polo shirt and jeans.

Engr. Nazmul, Niagara Textiles Ltd., Chandra Circle, Kaliakair, Gazipur, Bangladesh demotivated (2009) me about my book publication on wet processing technology(Hossain, 2009, 2023bh) who told me “go to Nilkhet, Dhaka and burn your published book immediately”. I didn’t say anything, I was just silent. Engr. Nazmul was wearing shirt and pant regularly and regularly. He was an officer (research & development). Publication and zero earning of Author, a high level of discourage of researcher/author/writer. If I send a manuscript to publisher/journal, I need to deal with article processing charge. But if I review a manuscript for journal, I am not getting money and I need to serve for free of cost. We need to work for publication industry, otherwise author may be demotivated.

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Engr. Amirul Islam, former academician, City University forwarded (2009) me to Niagara Textiles Ltd for my academic training/internship in 2009. He telephoned to Engr. Manjurul, Assistant Manager, Niagara Textiles Ltd. Engr. Amirul Islam was wearing shirt and pant regularly. Engr. Manjurul was wearing Panjabi and trouser. He was a very religious person.

Professor Shawkut Ali Khan, City University, Dhaka told (2020) me, “you are a small man but your achievement is great”. He was wearing shirt and pant. He kept bottom part of shirt inside of pant.

Dr. Bagchi, DJFT, University of Calcutta told (2014-2015) me “you will do better whatever you will do in your life”. He was wearing shirt and pant. He kept bottom part of shirt inside of pant.

I habituated to wear good dress from child schooling under father’s motivation in my family office. I can still remember that my child schooling had a good-looking dress code and it was mandatory. The dress was white color shirt, short pants (possibly black color) and white color shoe. My high schooling dress code was shirt and long pant. It was mandatory for both students and teachers, possibly an exceptional college in Bangladesh. There was prize money for good performers

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among students. Engr. Ashraf Kabir, Chairman ceased my job from his college when I applied for experience certificate from BCMC chairman office and I wanted to apply for both of PhD and job of government Universities in Bangladesh. I applied to Government Universities like Bangladesh Textile University, Dhaka University of Engineering & Technology, Jessore University of Science & Technology. I additionally paid for equivalence committee of my foreign certificate to every government University but I didn't get any invitation for Viva examination.

One day I had a very casual dress/winter dress in evening. I was walking beside the Sydney Street in Melbourne. I entered in a grocery shop of Chinese lady. Chinese lady checked my pocket when I approached to leave the shop. Another day, I entered same grocery shop of Chinese lady. I had a formal dress in evening after office hour in PhD school. Chinese lady told me when I approached to leave the shop, "how can I help you?". Chinese lady didn't check my pocket.

During my under graduate schooling, one of my physics professor named Mr. Md. Anowar Hossain City University, Bangladesh told me "you are looking like 'chief guest' in class". I had seen his dress code of shirt and long pant. He kept bottom part of shirt inside of pant.

Mr. Abdul Jabber (Kazol), Chief Executive Officer, Best exchange buying & fashion didn't make any comments about my family and dress code when I worked with him (2011-2012). I didn't discuss with him any family matters. He was not happy when I resigned the job. He was wearing same color polo shirt and jeans regularly and regularly. I was wearing shirt and pant.

Professor Dr. Abdul Jabber Khan, Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology, Viva-board chairman, Bangladesh public service commission told me (2019-2020) in Viva Board "if we don't give him (Anowar) job, brain will be drained to foreign country". It was very interesting matter for me. I got the letter of Australian Government RTP Stipend Scholarship before the date of Viva examination. Dr. Abdul had a dress code of shirt and pant. In same viva board, Prof. Masud Ahmed, former Vice Chancellor, Bangladesh Textile University told me, "If we give you

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job, you need to study a lot before going to every class”. He had a dress code of Panjabi and trouser.

During BSc schooling, one of my chemistry professor named Dr. Arun Kanti Guha, City University, Bangladesh told (2006-2007) me “you look like professor”. He hardly believed me and told me in class room “Possibly, Anowar will be a professor”. He told me in a class room of official teaching-learning environment “he may have a plan to be a professor”. He told me “Your hand writing is good”. She showed my chemistry answer script to all the students in a class room of official teaching-learning environment for getting highest marks. Dr. Arun Kanti Guha, Former professor, City University told (2015, 2016) me “you will get PhD Scholarship, try for scholarship, you may try for scholarship in USA”. I saw his dress code of white shirt and long pant (keeping bottom part of shirt inside of pant). I saw his dress code of white shirt, long pant and tie for his teaching duty in South East University, Bangladesh.

Late Md. Nazrul Islam, Former Headmaster, Mohonpur Public High School, Bangladesh told (1996-1997) me “your hand writing is good”. He showed my english answer script to all the students in a class room of official teaching-learning environment. I saw his dress code of shirt and long pants (keeping bottom part of shirt inside of pants).

Late Md. Baset, Headmaster, Majhpara Primary High School, Bangladesh told (1994-1995) me “your hand writing is good”. He showed my mathematics answer script to all the students in a class room of official teaching-learning environment when I got 100 marks out of 100 marks. He told me “You will get scholarship but I didn’t get scholarship in primary school”. I saw him dress code of white color Panjabi and long trouser.

In 2007-2008, Mr. Merul Huda (Dipu), assistant thana education officer (ATEO), Ghatail, Tangail told me, “In future, I will need to take permission to enter in your room”. In 2016, Mr. Dipu told me when I asked and planned to set up a textile engineering college in Ghatail, Tangail, “There is so many places in Bangladesh without Ghatail”. In 2016, Mr. Dipu also told me, “is it ok if your wife is primary school teacher”. In 2017, Mr. Dipu told me when I was lecturer in City University, “are

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students admitting in City University, Dhaka”. In 2016, Mr. Selim Hossen (Babu), Officer, Rupali Bank Ltd. Ghatail, Tangail told me when I asked and planned to set up a textile engineering college in Ghatail, Tangail “you may set up a textile engineering college in Kalihati instead of Ghatail”. I telephoned to Mr. Dipu and Mr. Babu in same day. They usually wear shirt and pant for office job. Mr. Dipu also wears blazer.

Senior Engr. Sukumar Roy, Chairman, KE technical Textiles Ltd, India gifted (2021) me glass fabric and polyester made hollow fabric for doing research in RMIT university. Unfortunately, I was unable to carry the glass fabric from Melbourne residence, 11/677, Park Street when I faced life threatening in Melbourne, Australia. Senior Engr. Sukumar Roy, Chairman, KE technical Textiles Ltd, India gifted me 4000INR for purchasing chemical from India when I was working for Bangladesh Textile & Fashion in 2016. I gifted him a technical finished inner garment (Bra). He taught me the right meaning of “self-motivation” through his presentation in (2014-2015). He had a dress code of white color shirt, pant and tie. He also wears t-shirt/polo shirt. Engr. Sukumar has excellent presentation skill. Mr. Mobarok, Managing Director, KE technical Textiles Ltd, India e-mailed me in 2023 who told me, “I thought that you will do better, somehow in any point in your life”. I saw him with polo shirt and pant in his Bangladesh office in 2016. I also saw him with polo shirt and pant when we were walking in evening at Nikunja Park, Dhaka.

Engr. Bithi Choudhury, BSc schooling professor, City University told (2009-2010) me “He (Engr. Anowar) may have a good plan for publication and teaching in future”. It was a discussion in a class room when I published my first book on “Basic Knowledge of wet processing technology”. Possibly, she was wearing short Borka in her teaching platform.

Professor Dr. Swapon Kumar Gosh, University of Calcutta told (2013-2015) me “you look like professor”. Dr. Swapon Kumar Gosh told me, “we will pay your living and fooding cost if you continue your PhD here”. Dr. Swapon Kumar Gosh told me (2017-2018), “you are worried about PhD, but you are not worried about your marriage”. I had seen his dress code of shirt and long pants keeping (bottom part of shirt inside of pants). One day he just called and told me during Eid-vacation, “you should go to your village residence, your mother is alone in village”(Hossain, 2023aw, 2023ax, 2023ay). He was worried about my family. I didn’t discuss with him about my family. Another day/same day, Mr. Milton, Former MTech student, Department of Bio-medical and instrumentation, University of Calcutta is one of my Calcutta university friend telephoned me. He just called and told me during Eid-vacation, “you should go to your village residence, your mother is alone in village”(Hossain, 2023aw, 2023ax, 2023ay). He was worried about my family. I didn’t discuss with him about my family and relative peoples. I usually write my draft of publication during holiday. For example: I wrote my book entitled “Basic Knowledge of wet processing” during Eid-vacation in Bangladesh when I was pursuing my Bachelor of Science in Textile Engineering. Engr. Sabbir wears shirt and pant. Mr. Milton also wears shirt and pant. They also kept bottom part of shirt inside of pant.

Professor (Dr.) Sunil Kumar Sett, University of Calcutta told (2014-2015) me, “Anowar knows whole Kolkata”. Professor (Dr.) Sunil Kumar Sett told me, “you can just connect with a professor for your PhD”. He was wearing shirt and pant regularly. Professor (Dr.) Asis Mukhopadhyay, University of Calcutta told (2014-2015) me, “Anowar likes Kolkata, he may stay Kolkata after graduation”. He was wearing shirt and pant regularly.

Engr. Rokonzaman, Chairman, Department of Textile Engineering, Maulana Bhasani Science and Technology University told (2022) me when I asked the support of data color machine/spectrophotometer, “we don’t allow other university student in our laboratory”. He has expertise in yarn manufacturing engineering. He is my BSc schooling professor in Yarn manufacturing. Engr. Rokonzaman wears shirt and pants regularly.

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Engr. Rumvi, PhD Scholar, RMIT University told me, “staying with wife is tasty”. She wears jeans/pant and t-shirt for her research duty in PhD school. She had a smiling face in discussion moment. She was doing her PhD research on medical textiles. She was doing project works of Professor (Dr.) Rajiv Padhye, RMIT University. She worked together with Mrs. Tanushree, PhD candidate, RMIT University in wet processing laboratory. Mrs. Tanushree had a dress code of shari. Sometimes I saw her with pant and tops.

In 2007-2009, Dr. Rina Khanum told in a class room of Technical Textiles, City University, Dhaka, Bangladesh, “I have purchased two set of three piece for my Eid clothing, price around 500BDT/set”. She had a dress code of salwar, kameez and orna for her teaching duty in City University.

In 2012-13, Mr. Chatak, Chief operation Manager, Gothic design Ltd., Viyellatex Group told me about my mother’s payment(Hossain, 2023aw, 2023ax, 2023ay), but I didn’t discuss about my family/relative people with manger/office. He was worried my mother’s payment. Mr. Chatak told me “You need to visit your village residence, lead/stand by raising your head in village”. I got show cause notice after six months of my job. Manager reported me that he was not satisfied with my performance. Human resource officer told me “take a piece of paper and discuss with manager point by point”. Few months, I worked under Mr. Masudur Rahman, Chief executive officer. I paid one month salary when I left the organization although I got reimbursement from office. I resigned the job and manager was not happy. Later (2016) Mr. Chatak offered me a ‘marriage proposal’ with his relative female in Jessore when I was serving for BCMC college, Jessore. Mr. Chatak has a good communication skill both in writing and oral. Mr. Chatak was wearing shirt and pant regularly. He had no casual dress for a single day. Mr. Masudur Rahman, CEO was also wearing shirt/polo shirt and pant.

Mr. Masudur Rahman, CEO told me when I left the organization, “Please excuse me if we have any mistake”

Mr. Masudur Rahman, CEO told me, “you have no obligation to come in my room, nobody restricted you”

Mr. Masudur Rahman, CEO told me, “Chairman (possibly Mr. Debit) appreciated your e-mail, sent to buying office, S Oliver”. I had follow-up of S. Oliver buyer.

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Mr. Masudur Rahman, CEO told me in an official meeting, “thinking is also work”.

In 2010-11, Mr. Anam, lab incharge, Mascom composite Ltd., Bangladesh told me about my mother’s payment (Hossain, 2023aw, 2023ax, 2023ay), but I didn’t discuss about my family/relative people with manger/office. I worked in dyeing and finishing production unit under the direction of Chairman, Mr. Samsuddin. There was very interesting matter of my job appointment. I applied through BD jobs. I attended in viva. There was a written examination in the room of Chief executive officer, Mr. Harunur Rashid. There were few candidates and I was the last person attended for viva. I got an answer script for writing and answering question. I was writing and writing and submitting to chief executive officer. Last moment he called me for lunch and forwarded me to the head of Merchandising department. I started my office duty in merchandising department. I visited different buying house through senior merchandisers. Later I shifted to Dyeing and finishing department as R&D officer. My first month salary was 5000 BDT in Merchandising department when I didn’t ask about my salary. After second month, the salary was 12000BDT (consolidated) in dyeing and finishing department under written and oral consultation with chairman and chief executive officer. Mr. Md. Shamsuddin, Chairman of Mascom composite ltd. told me (2010) “you look like the people of buying house”. It was my first job in textile industry. He felt that Anowar was looking good. Mr. Md. Shamsuddin, Chairman of Mascom composite ltd. told me “if you cannot operate all the dyeing machine in my production unit, I will cease your job”. I was able to operate sample dyeing machine independently. Mr. Md. Shamsuddin told me “You may do better in marketing job in chemical company. Mr. Md. Shamsuddin told me “You will also be the General Manager after ten years”. Mr. Md. Shamsuddin told me “Can you work as broker like Mr. Romzan Ali, Dyeing manager, possibly you cannot”. He recommended me for marketing job in chemical company. He was wearing Panjabi and long trouser regularly. Mr. Romzan Ali was wearing shirt and pant regularly. He had good level of communication skill. One day, Director asked me, “what is “recipe”? I was able to answer, still director asked me, “can you call to your university professor and ask the question in front of me”. I was little bit bothered and called to Professor (Dr.) Saifur Rahman. Director told me, “we are investing for you”. I got sample dyeing machine for R&D. I was dyeing with a green color recipe to signify the effect of peroxide killer in the dyebath of cotton fabric(Hossain, 2009). I spent a lot of time for shade matching. The color shade was tending to yellowish. However, I was able to signify the effect peroxide killer in dyebath. Different time, I always reported production headache to chairman by writing and writing. Sometimes, chairman couldn’t believe my writing and telling. He also checked my ‘writing and saying’ with Professor (Dr.) Mahbub by telephone. My decision was matched with the comments of Professor (Dr.) Mahbub.

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Mrs. Jarin Yasmin, Assistant Professor, City university invited me in dinar party in Uttara, Dhaka, Bangladesh. Mrs. Jarin Yasmin told me “Is it ok for you if the lady has second marriage”. She wears the combination of salwar, kameez, orna. She also wears shari for her teaching duty.

In 2016, I had a production of technical finished Bra under trading of Bangladesh Textile & Fashion. There is also applications of medical textiles and cosmetic textiles. One of my uncle (Mr. Moti) discussed with other person. I heard few words by chance. He told about me “Anowar is doing business of Bra (ladies tank top), this is not good, how can an educated person can do such business?” Engr. Pabitra, former operation manager, Niagara Textiles Ltd. told me “You didn’t get any business rather than Bra”. Bra is a lady’s cloth. A textile engineer should not get shame to talk with Bra and it is very related business of a textile engineer. I worked (2010) with Bra design and Bra Production and submitted Bra sample to international Buyer, Bershka when I worked with Radix Ltd., a sister concern of Mascom Composite Ltd. under Mr. Masud, Senior Merchandiser. Mr. Masud had a dress code of shirt and pant regularly. He was sincere about his duty. He had good communication skill (verbal).

Late Mockbul Hossen, Founder Chairman, City University, Dhaka told (2017-2019) me in a meeting when I was a lecturer, City University, “He (Anowar) looks like student”. Chairman told me in front of Engr. Nafiz, Lecturer, City University and other professors/officials. Chairman had regular dress code (2006-2010, 2017-2019) of Panjabi and trouser.

Professor Dr. Md. Mahbulul Haque, Former Head, Department of Textile Engineering, Daffodil International University, Bangladesh told (2017-2018) me in a conference, City University, Dhaka, “you can do PhD from University of Calcutta”. Dr. Md. Mahbulul Haque had a dress code of shirt and pant.

Prof. Dr. ABM Abdullah, Primeasia University told me (2016-2017), “you can do patent of your fragrance finished product”. Prof. Dr. ABM Abdullah had a dress code of shirt and pant for his teaching duty in university.

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Engr. Sutapa Choudhury, Associate professor, Bangladesh Textile University is so much senior than me. She called me ‘Anowar Vai (brother)’ although she is senior than me. I do not say anything if she feels happy to say accordingly. Her dress code was the combination of salwar, kameez and orna at PhD school in Australia.

In 2017-2018, Professor (Dr.) Dil Afroza Begum, Viva-board chairman, commonwealth PhD scholarship, University Grants Commission told me “Herriot-watt University is selling certificate” when I submitted a PhD confirmation letter from Herriot-watt University. Possibly, she was wearing shari in office. Viva-board members told me “He (Anowar) paid for his publication”. But I didn’t pay for publication when I was serving for City University. I only paid for one publication, 100USD although my professor was not agreeing to pay. Under present situation, author need to pay to journal for a good quality manuscript. Non-paid publication system should be established globally for the support of author when reviewers have no financial benefit for their assessment works. Whatever, maximum Viva board has a tendency to assess University rather than candidate. Profile marking of a candidate has no relationship with Viva examination. So, the candidate profile/background universities can be anonymous for assessment in Viva examination. An anonymous Viva (double blind/single blind) may be continued and practiced for exact marking in Viva Board. For example, Viva board will not know the candidate. Similarly, candidate will not know the members of a Viva board. If a professor assesses his student in competitive viva examination, professor may have a favour of his student for competitive selection. City University professor may have a priority to City University students and Dhaka University professor may have a priority of Dhaka University student in a Viva board. So, a Dhaka University Professor should not assess Dhaka university student for a competitive Viva Examination and a City University Professor should not assess City university student for a competitive Viva Examination.

In 2017-2018, Professor Dr. Abdul Mannan, Viva-board chairman, PhD scholarship, University Grants Commission told me when I officially worked and met with dean, Faculty of science and technology, University of Chittagong when I worked with the exam controller, university of Chittagong when I worked as chairman and member of examination committee, University of Chittagong, “There is no college named New castle University college affiliated by University of

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Chittagong”. Professor Dr. Abdul Mannan asked me “what is the name of Vice Chancellor, City University”. Professor Dr. Abdul Mannan asked me “How many students in your department, City University?” Dr. Mannan had a dress code of white shirt and pant in office. In 2016, Chairman of Newcastle University college was angry when I resigned the job from his college who locked me in a room, I immediately called to Police through a local person (father of Ms. Safa, former lecturer, Newcastle University college). Police ensured my salary and safety for leaving the college properly. Police officer advised me for making a general diary and wrote the history without taking single coin. Mr. Arif, Chairman was wearing shirt and pant. He was always wearing good looking dress. Chairman advised me “do not show your power with everyone in future, people may harm you; there is so many bad people”. I didn’t show my power I just protected myself in proper way. Chairman told me about my mother’s payment in his casual discussion, but I didn’t discuss with him about my mother/family history(Hossain, 2023aw, 2023ax, 2023ay). I didn’t get any payment from the office of exam controller, University of Chittagong, Bangladesh although I directly worked (2016) with the administration of exam controller, University of Chittagong when Professor Dr. Iftekhar Uddin Choudhury was the Vice Chancellor of University of Chittagong. I, Md. Anowar Hossain, appointed/recommended Engr. Ismat Zerine, lecturer, National Institute of Textile Training, Research and Design (NITTRAD) for answer script evaluation who didn’t get any payment from University of Chittagong. I felt shame when Engr. Ismat Zerine asked me accordingly. Engr. Ismat Zerine, former lecturer, City University told (2009) me when I acknowledged to Chairman, City University in my project report and internship report “your report is exceptional, you may show it to Chairman”. Her dress code was salwar, kameez and orna.

Professor Dr. Lijing Wang, my Senior supervisor, PhD school, School of Fashion & Textiles, RMIT University told me (2020-2021) “you should not be so much looking good in PhD school”.

Another day he told me in microsoft team meeting (2021), “you are not looking good, Sharif is looking good”. I do not know that who is sharif.

Dr. Lijing Wang told me in PhD School (2021), “you are exceptional”. Dr. Lijing Wang was harmonized his tone with Professor (Dr.) Rajiv Padhye.

Dr. Lijing Wang told me (2021), “you are eating good food in Australia, so your manuscript writing skill is also good in Australia”.

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Dr. Lijing Wang told me (2021), “we need to provide sex support to Anowar”.

Dr. Lijing Wang told me (2020) when I asked for teaching scope in RMIT University, “we will offer you job in school after 1.5/2 years if you can perform well in PhD research in PhD school”.

Dr. Lijing Wang told me in 2021, “The editor of defence technology journal telephoned me for your manuscript submission (second time) on camouflage textiles”.

Dr. Lijing Wang told me (2020), “your PhD scholarship is your achievement”.

Dr. Lijing Wang told me (2020), “Your PhD work is your, this is your PhD”.

Dr. Lijing Wang told me (2020) in front of Dr. Sean, RMIT University in a Microsoft team meeting when I submitted manuscript for review, “he (Anowar) is giving me a lot of work”.

Dr. Lijing Wang told me (2020) in front of Dr. Sean, HDR coordinator, RMIT University in a Microsoft team meeting, a meeting for confirmation of action and support “if you do all of your PhD work earlier, you will not get full fund of PhD scholarship”. In this meeting, I heard the voice of Bengali language. Someone cited in Bengali Language, “Literature review paper has existing of literature review, what is the necessity of doing literature review?”.

I was little bit confused relates to my dress code in PhD school. Still, I tried to wear a combination of long pants and shirt stitched in Bangladesh. I feel good to wear a good dress. I feel that dress code is a matter of personal interest aligned with reasonable fashion practiced worldwide. Professor Dr. Lijing Wang had a dress code of long pants and shirt (keeping bottom part of shirt inside of pants). Professor Lijing also wears blazer during winter. Very sometimes he was wearing polo shirt. I purchased a larger size (XXL) shirt from cats eye, branded shop in Bangladesh before going to Australia. I thought that the height of my Chinese supervisor will be tall. The shirt size was exactly matched with my professor. One day I met with my professor in Brunswick Campus during COVID-19 restriction. I was little bit afraid to approach my gift to supervisor. He was not interested to accept my gift. He told me “I am happy to supervise you”. Professor Lijing Wang told me “I am happy, if I can say that I have a PhD student in Bangladesh”. Finally, he received my very simple gift. One day he gave me a big box of chocolate for my child but I had no child.

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I am also remarking one of my Jahangirnagar university professor named Dr. Nurul Abser who wear very casual dress like long pants and polo shirt/shirt. I met with him with formal dress like long pants and shirt. I kept bottom part of shirt inside of my pant. He didn't make any comments regarding my dress code in PhD school.

Emeritus Professor (Dr.) Robert Shanks, my Associate supervisor, PhD School, School of Fashion & Textiles, RMIT University gifted me (2020) a good quality research note book during first meeting and first introducing in PhD school. I just received. I gifted a Bangladeshi Shirt (cats eye brand) to my RMIT University Professor named Dr. Robert Shanks. I was little bit afraid if he doesn't receive my gift, I may feel shame. Firstly, he told me "you can wear this shirt". I told him that this is your size, larger size. Finally, professor received my gift. It was a PhD meeting located at Princes Park, Melbourne beside my residence. Another day professor wore my gifted shirt by the combination of long pant and showed and told me in an official meeting of PhD school located at Melbourne state Library. Another day professor gave me a good quality blue color pen in Brunswick campus. Professor (Dr.) Robert Shanks told me, "we will give you project after your confirmation of PhD candidature". Emeritus Professor (Dr.) Robert Shanks had a dress code of shirt and pant. One day I saw him with polo shirt and pant when he drove his car.

I had a contradiction with Professor (Dr.) Sunil Dhar, Department of Mathematics, Chittagong University of Engineering and Technology. He wanted to take the classes of Textile Physics in BSc Schooling. I disagreed to give him the class of textile physics for textile engineering students although I agreed to give him the chapter of fluid mechanics only. He was the academic director of Newcastle University College, Chittagong, Bangladesh. He had a regular dress code of shirt and pants. He always kept bottom part of shirt inside of pant. He had also tie and blazer for his teaching duty and meeting attendance.

Professor (Dr.) Rajiv Padhye, School of Fashion & Textiles, RMIT University, Australia told me at PhD School "you are exceptional". Professor (Dr.) Rajiv Padhye told me, "I envy you". Professor (Dr.) Rajiv Padhye told me, "I will be student of Anowar". Professor (Dr.) Rajiv Padhye told me, "I didn't see such type of meritorious person in my life". Professor (Dr.) Rajiv Padhye told me, "I didn't see such type of meritorious person in my life". Professor (Dr.) Rajiv Padhye told me, "I will

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give him hard recommendation for his RMIT PhD degree”. He wanted to mention this exceptional voice in his recommendation letter of PhD degree/job recommendation. What should I do if professor envies me? Probably, keeping a distance may be a self-protection. I had seen the dress code of Professor Dr. Rajiv Padhye at PhD school. Probably four days, I saw him with a blue shirt by the combination of long pants. Another day I saw him with a white stripe shirt by the combination long pants (keeping bottom part of shirt inside of pant). Professor Rajiv also wears blazer during winter. Professor (Dr.) Rajiv Padhye told me, “RMIT University/Australia identified the actual merit of Anowar, City University/Bangladesh will not get any credit of Anowar’s research contribution/merit contribution”. Professor (Dr.) Rajiv Padhye told me in 2021, “Arif will not take Anowar, Arif will give job of his wife in City University”. I am still confused that who is Arif, is he Bangladeshi/Indian/Chinese/Australian/Any other country. Professor (Dr.) Rajiv Padhye also told me in 2021, “How can he (Engr Anowar) marry a sex worker”. Professor Rajiv told me, “Why abdur rahman is saying ‘tumi’ to Anowar, he should say ‘apni’ to Anowar, they are not from same university”. Tumi and apni are Bengali terms of relationship and English meaning is you. Who is this Abdur Rahman? Is he Bangladeshi/Indian/Chinese/Australian? It was not purely confirmed to me. Professor (Dr.) Rajiv Padhye told me (2021), “Anowar may have one wife in Bangladesh, one wife in India and one wife in Australia”.

A/Professor Bari, Head of the Department, Department of English, City University told (2020) me, “After having your PhD, you will just take tea with us and you will get salary around two lac BDT”. He commented and advised about my study leave application in the office of additional registrar, City University, “you may skip the requesting of salary during study leave, possibly City University will not pay you during study leave, hence the approval time of study leave may be longer and longer”. He had a dress code of shirt, pant and tie.

In 2022, Professor (Dr.) Md. Forhad Hossain, Bangladesh Textile University, Dhaka told me when I expected a specialized suggestion about my hidden life threatening in Melbourne “you may go to attorney, but the final decision is your”. In 2018-2019, Professor (Dr.) Forhad told me “if City University, Dhaka has no issue with the PhD degree of Jahangirnagar University, I have no problem to supervise you, ask to City University about the acceptance of PhD degree of Jahangirnagar University”. He was wearing pant and shirt. He kept bottom part of shirt inside of pant.

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I had seen the dress code of USA professor at RMIT PhD school named Dr. Steve Michelson. I saw his dress code of shirt and long pants (keeping bottom part of shirt inside of pants). One day I enjoyed his presentation. He told in his research presentation “I supervised few PhD student and this presentation is the combination of whole summery of research outcome”.

I had seen the dress code in RMIT PhD school named Dr. Sean Ryan, lecturer, School of Fashion & Textiles. I had seen his dress code of shirt/polo shirts and long pants (keeping bottom part of shirt inside of pants). I had seen the dress code in RMIT PhD school named Dr. Xin. Dr. Xin gave me a research paper on smart textiles. I had seen his dress code of shirt and long pants who kept bottom part of shirt inside of pants. Dr. Scott Mayson was wearing the dress code of t-shirt and long pant. I saw the dress code of Dr. Andrea, a lady professor in RMIT PhD school. She was wearing t-shirt and semi-long trouser/pant in a school get-together. I had seen short borka, wearing by the professor in milestone conference in Australia. Borka is a female dress for maximum covering of body. Borka is a good quality ladies fashion. This fashion is not only sign of religious female.

Dr. Jonathon Tersur Orasug, a Nigerian national, post-doctoral researcher, University of Johannesburg repeatedly called me Dr. Anowar during my MTEch schooling in University of Calcutta. Dr. Jonathon told me “Economy Anowar”. He was wearing by the combination of shirt, long pant (keeping bottom part of shirt inside of pants) and tie. He went to Churge by wearing short tie. He likes ‘Biryani’ in his food item.

Dr. Nilendu was a PhD scholar when I was an MTEch student in university of Calcutta. I had seen his dress code of shirt and long pants (keeping bottom part of shirt inside of pants). I didn’t see him with casual dress. He was a PhD student of professor Dr. AK Samanta, University of Calcutta. Professor AK Samanta had also a formal dress code of white shirt and long pants (keeping bottom part of shirt inside of pants). I didn’t see him with casual dress like t-shirt and polo shirt. Professor Samanta also wear blazer during winter.

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Professor AK Samanta commanded (2014) me, "you need to work 8:00am to 8:00pm in wet processing laboratory".

Professor AK Samanta told (2020) me in front of Professor Ayub Nabi Khan, BGMEA University of Fashion & Technology, "Anowar is a silent worker". Dr. Ayub Nabi Khan invited me to meet with him next time. I saw Dr. Ayub Nabi in NITTRAD, Dhaka. He was wearing shirt and pant. He kept bottom part of shirt inside of pant.

Professor AK Samanta told me, "if Anowar get PhD from RMIT University, Anowar will not respect me".

Professor AK Samanta told me when I telephoned him from Australia (2021), "If I send a letter to RMIT University, your scholarship will have a problem".

Professor AK Samanta told me when I telephoned him from Australia (2021) when I faced life-threatening in Melbourne, "nobody can beat you".

Professor AK Samanta told me when I talked about confirmation of my PhD scholarship in RMIT University, "I also got job in RMIT University but I didn't go when I got the extension of my Calcutta University Job".

Professor (Dr.) AK Samanta indirectly told me that someone called him from Bangladesh when I was a student of Calcutta University (2014/2015), possibly it was related to my marriage/other inquiry(Hossain, 2023az, 2023ba, 2023bc). I was just silent. I didn't tell him anything about my family/relative peoples. Every telephone receiver of any country should get proper introducing/confirmation before talking with someone. Written communication is better than telephone communication in any official platform.

Professor (Dr.) Debashis, University of Calcutta also slightly commented about my family and regarding my family funding(Hossain, 2023aw, 2023ax, 2023az). I didn't discuss anything about my family with him. I was just silent. He was wearing shirt and pant.

Professor (Dr.) Sadhan Chandra Roy, University of Calcutta (2014-15) also indirectly told me "if we don't know your financial crisis, how can we help you? we had also scholarship for student". I was just silent. I didn't discuss anything about my financial crisis with him(Hossain, 2023aw, 2023ax, 2023ay). He was wearing shirt and pant regularly. He kept bottom part of shirt inside of pant regularly. When I met with him first day, he handshaked with me. He also arranged tea and biscuit for me when I was attending and reporting first day in the office of Head of the

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Department, University of Calcutta as foreign student. So many professors dislike to do handshake with students. Sometime, I also do handshake with my student. I also do handshake with child.

Dr. Md. Saifur Rahman, Former Associate professor and Head of the Department, City University told me (2017-2019) “Anowar, you will get PhD scholarship, send me biodata; you didn’t tell me that you want to get PhD”. Dr. Saifur Rahman was not happy with my MTech Degree who negatively commented about my MTech Thesis without looking and judging it (Hossain, 2015a, 2015b; Samanta et al., 2016). He was wearing shirt and pant. He always kept bottom part of shirt inside of pant. He is my BSc schooling professor in polymer science.

Mr. Ravi, researcher in Master degree level told me, “is it ok in your religion if you have double marriage?”. Mr. Ravi had a dress code of short pant and t-shirt for his laboratory works. He had four supervisors for his master degree. He also wears long pant and shirt for his research duty.

Dr. Saniyat Islam, RMIT University cited the words of another person when he was not happy my regular attendance in PhD school, “office in work or work in office”. One day I search him in his office but I didn’t get him. I had three days casual meeting with him in Brunswick campus, RMIT University. He had a regular dress code of polo shirt and pant.

Engr. Arifuzzaman (2010), Assistant Professor, City University told me in a Tablig jamat inside of mosque when I acknowledged the name of professors in my first published book “do not think that you will be bigger by the name of high-profile person”. Engr. Arifuzzaman, Assistant Professor, City University told me (2017), “we will see you for six months, “we will not give you salary for six months”. In 2017-2019, Engr. Arifuzzaman, Assistant Professor, City University ordered me to cut chicken and onion for official cooking purpose in office time. Different time, Engr. Arifuzzaman cooked food of various item for the teachers of City University. Engr. Arifuzzaman (2017) told me, “I need to see him (Anowar) more”. Engr. Arifuzzaman told me, “Nobody will get benefit from Anowar”. Engr. Arifuzzaman told me “I envy you”. Engr. Arifuzzaman in City University, a male professor calls me ‘Anowar Sir’ although he is my senior colleague and my

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professor of 'Production planning'. Engr. Arifuzzaman told me, "he (Anowar) is not paying his mother, he is not doing job in garments industry, he is in teaching profession"(Hossain, 2023aw, 2023ax, 2023ay). I didn't discuss with him about my family/father/mother. Another day, Engr. Arifuzzaman commanded to Engr. Farid, "beat behind neck side of Anowar". I was just silent. Neck is a sensitive place of a man. In 2018, Engr. Arifuzzaman told me, "You will manage lady, you will arrange marriage, you will manage everything, we will get invitation". Engr. Arifuzzaman told me (2018-2019) who was not happy for my publication activities, "we will publish his (Anowar) manuscript again, by putting our name". Engr. Arifuzzaman told (2019) me, "head sir (Dr. Saiful islam) may cease your job". Engr. Arifuzzaman told me when I didn't report/tell to office about my marriage, "we will go to Anowar's residence (Savar) and we will break everything". He fed me marriage sweet by force. Engr. Nafiz uploaded the picture of sweet feeding in facebook. Engr. Arifuzzaman was wearing Panjabi and trouser in BSc engineering school, City University, Bangladesh. After coming from Australia (2022), I met with Engr. Arifuzzaman in his office who told me "Are you planning to send your picture in immigration/boarder". Engr. Arifuzzaman verbally permitted and told me "Anowar Sir, can you do experiment of my life". So, I have written something about him under oral permission. Engr. Arifuzzaman told me in 2022, "Go to Australia without wife". I didn't discuss anything about my wife and family matters with him.

In 2017-2019, Engr. Farid told me, "You look like scientist", "you look like Stephen Hawking". Engr. Farid told me, "I will give assignment to my students to collect personal information of Anowar Sir"(Hossain, 2023aw, 2023ax, 2023ay). One day, he edited my duty of exam hall invigilation without informing me and bothered me. Engr. Farid was wearing shirt/polo shirt and pant. He kept bottom part of shirt inside the pant.

Mr. Nazrul Islam, additional Registrar, City University, Dhaka told me after my marriage (2017-2019), "Marriage is not a crime". He had regular a dress code of shirt, pant, blazer and tie. He didn't make any comment about my dress code in City University, Dhaka.

In 2022, Engr. Murshida khatun, Lecturer, City University told me "How can you get scholarship without IELTS". I applied scholarship without IELTS and I got scholarship without IELTS. Later I did

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IELTS for getting Australian Student VISA, but VISA office didn't ask me IELTS certificate and issued me VISA without IELTS. Engr. Murshida khatun always wears full covering dress/borka.

In 2022, Mr. Mehedi Hasan Khan Rupok, Lecturer, City University told me "Nothing will happen in Australia for your writing, do not be afraid". He is always wearing Panjabi and trouser. In 2018-2019, I got a printed marksheet of Engr. Rupok in my office desk who got A+ in SSC/HSC.

Engr. Rowshanuzzaman, (Kanon), Lecturer, City University told (2021-2022) me, "your speech is a proverb when I had a little discussion/e-mail correspondence from Australia". He was wearing shirt and pant.

Engr. Toma, Lecturer, City University told me (2017-2019), "I am afraid to Anowar Sir". I heard the voice by chance. Later she had tea meeting with me but she didn't get afraid to me. She was wearing salwar, kameez and orna. She had also dress code of shari.

Dr. Ranojit Kumar Dutta, Associate Professor, City University told (2018-2019) me his PhD story. He told me "a PhD student need to go through a pipeline/system for achieving a PhD degree". Dr. Ranojit told me in his casual discussion "a student of city university may be a Vice Chancellor of City University in future, we need to treat them accordingly". Dr. Ronozit, a male professor in City University was wearing shirt and trouser (keeping bottom part of shirt inside of pants) in BSc engineering school, City University.

In 2016-2017, Mr. Jahirul Islam, Assistant Director, University Grants Commission told me, "We faced trouble to confirm equivalence of your MTEch Degree, University of Calcutta; Committee member discussed with the concern (Probably Vice Chancellor/VC office) of Bangladesh University of Textiles (BuTex)". BuTex concern reported that how a City University student can get MTEch degree from University of Calcutta?" Finally, I got equivalence certificate from UGC office. Professor Swapon Kumar Gosh (2018-2019), University of Calcutta told me, "we are not doing office in Kolkata for you". Possibly, someone from Bangladesh made a time-consuming

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telephone/investigation. Mr. Jahirul Islam was wearing shirt and pant as UGC official in Bangladesh.

Mr. Mahmud, a male professor in City University bothered me by kissing in my brain when I kept my hair very small. He told me about my financial crisis and struggling during child schooling (Hossain, 2023aw, 2023ax, 2023ay, 2023ba). I heard the voices by chance. Mr. Mahmud told me, "Let's visit your village residence by my car". Mr. Mahmud told me, "Do not marry, single is good". He was wearing t-shirt/polo-shirt/shirt and trouser/pant. He had a regular practice of casual dress.

Professor (Dr.) M. Ibrahim H. Mondal, University of Rajshahi, Bangladesh told me (2016), "Anowar, PhD is a loss project". Dr. Ibrahim told me (2016), "You may check UGC website and try for UGC scholarship". I tried for UGC scholarship. He was wearing shirt and pant.

Professor (Dr.) Md. Monimul Huque, City University told me in a conference of City University (2018-2019), "Professor (Dr.) Mubarak Ahmad Khan had a wrong presentation in a conference of Germany". Professor (Dr.) Md. Monimul Huque also expressed about his book writing skill, "I write book in first morning of a day". Professor (Dr.) Mobarok advised me to continue PhD on natural dyeing under Professor (Dr.) AK Samanta, University of Calcutta who also cited the name of Professor (Dr.) Mahbulul Bashar, Maulana Bhashani University of Science and Technology. I met with Professor (Dr.) Mahbulul Bashar for his casual testing support of data color machine in 2022 who told me, "This is not a testing centre, but we can do research collaboration with your affiliated university". Professor (Dr.) Mahbulul Bashar asked me, "what is the research background of your PhD supervisor in Australia". Professor (Dr.) Mahbulul Bashar had a dress code of shirt and pant. Professor (Dr.) Mobarok had a dress code of shirt and pant. He kept bottom part of shirt inside of pant. Professor (Dr.) Md. Monimul Huque had a dress code of shirt and pant who always kept bottom part of shirt inside of pant.

I had a coffee meeting with Professor (Dr.) Humayun. Dean, Faculty of Science and Engineering, City University, Dhaka. I shortly explained my hidden life-threatening history in Melbourne

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(Hossain, 2023az, 2023ba, 2023bb, 2023bc) in 2022 after coming from Australia. Professor (Dr.) Humayun told me, “Did you meet with mental health doctor, you may go to square hospital”. He had a dress code of shirt, pant, blazer and tie.

One of my nephew (Mr. Nirob) is studying to be a Hafez in my village mosque school, administered by Mosque committee, a non-paid committee in village. A Hafez is able to cite and explain whole quran (a book of global civilization). My nephew looks like Hafez but he is not a Hafez, he has just started his child schooling. He is practicing his dress code of Panjabi and trouser from his early schooling. This dress code is administered by his mentor in school. This dress code is almost mandatory for the students who are practicing to be Hafez. Similarly, every professor should motivate his student for choosing a good-looking dress and/or right dress. This is not a matter of envy; this is a matter of right schooling; this is a matter of right guideline to university student. This is a matter of practicing dress code from primary schooling to PhD schooling and professional journey.

In 2005-2006, Professor (Dr.) Kamruzzaman, former principal, Government Sadat College, Tangail told me when I was about to miss one year to admit in public university “police will not arrest you from your house if you don’t continue your bachelor study under National University in Bangladesh”. My father told me, “Professor Kamruzzaman is the top higher educated person in our local area, he is a good person so far I know”. One day I introduced/met (2003) with Dr. Kamruzzaman through my father, late Md. Abdur Rashid. He was wearing shirt and pant. He didn’t keep bottom part of shirt outside of his pant. I saw in his office that one professor kept bottom part of shirt inside of pant.

Mr. Sarwar Jahan Shamim, Bar-at-law, Advocate Supreme court of Bangladesh told me (2023), “Do not go to court, there is also a matter of diverting/bias decision in court”. I didn’t see any specific subject for ethical assessment from primary schooling to PhD schooling. Possibly it is necessity to certify ‘ethics of a person’ from primary schooling to PhD schooling. He was wearing shirt and pant. I (Md. Anowar Hossain) am worried about the verbal crimes of different peoples under present situation of global journey(Hossain, 2023aw, 2023ax, 2023ay, 2023az, 2023ba, 2023bb, 2023bc). Verbal crimes can be transferred to life-threatening whatever I faced in PhD

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school, Australia. A person can easily decline his verbal crime when he is about to get punishment. There is so many lawyers for protection of known criminal under receiving money which should be against of professional ethics. Mr. Sarwar Jahan Shamim told me, “There is legal service of a lawyer in terms of different payment rate of a client such as 500BDT, 5000BDT, 50000BDT and 100000BDT. Legal service of a lawyer should be very specified through the exact payment rate to a lawyer, otherwise client may be confused and there is also a matter of unethical earning of a lawyer when lawyer only serve for social contribution under professional ethics. Advocate K.P. Mazumder, Advocate, Calcutta High Court, Kolkata, West Bengal, India told me (2013-2015), “I do not receive fee from student/student of Calcutta University”. He wrote legal explanation through his assistant and took 10INR for printing cost only. It was possibly for notarized and certified legal explanation for submission to High Commission of Bangladesh, India for receiving ‘no objection certificate’ from High Commission of Bangladesh, India to satisfy admission requirement in Department of Jute and Fibre Technology, University of Calcutta, India. Advocate K.P. Mazumder had a dress code of white shirt and pant.

In 2015, Engr. Tajul Islam Mollah, former Head and Professor, Department of Textile Engineering, BCMC college of Engineering and Technology, Jessore, Bangladesh affiliated by University of Rajshahi was not happy for my book publication who didn’t read my book on Basic Knowledge of Wet Processing Technology. He had a dress code of shirt and pant for his teaching duty.

Professor (Dr.) Subhas Ghosh, Program coordinator; Apparel, Textiles and Merchandising; School of Technology Studies, Eastern Michigan University told me, “You may try for PhD scholarship, self-finance PhD will be struggling for you, still you can do PhD if you are determined”. Dr. Subhas had a dress code of shirt and pant.

Professor Kabir, Govt. Gopalpur College, Tangail, Bangladesh told me in a class room in 2003-2004, “Anowar is my neighbour”. In 2022, he introduced me the term of ‘slow poison’ when I walked with him in morning/evening in a casual meeting when I had a little discussion about my life-threatening history in PhD school, Melbourne, Australia. He has good fluency in speaking English. He also speaks English with the village peoples. He had a dress code shirt and pant. He kept bottom part of shirt inside of pant for his teaching duty in college. Professor Narayon, Govt.

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Gopalpur College told me (2003-2004), “you will read and read mathematics terms when you will walk beside the paddy field when he taught me in a one-to-one private class room”. He had a dress code of white shirt and pant.

Mr. Alomgir, Senior Teacher (science schooling), Shuti Hossen Shahid Shohrawardi High School, Gopalpur, Tangail told me in a casual meeting in 2022, “you are the person who had good hand writing”. I studied Shuti Hossen Shahid Shohrawardi High School in 1998-1999. He beat me on my hand when I got poor marks/unable to solve all mathematics in a scholarship coaching (possibly night coaching). He taught me free of cost in scholarship coaching. He had a regular dress code of shirt and pant. He always kept bottom part of shirt inside of pant.

Dr. Motiar Rahman, Former medical officer, Gopalpur hospital, Gopalpur, Tangail told (2022) me, “Anowar, I have no higher education like you”. I introduced with him through my father late Md. Abdur Rashid in 1995-1996 when I was a primary school student. He asked me a translation from Bengali to English. Different time he advised/asked me about my education during casual meeting in my local area. He had a dress code of shirt and pant when I met with him in 2002-2004. He was wearing Panjabi and trouser when I met with him in 2022-2023.

Engr. Arnob, Assistant professor, City University told me when I little bit discussed about my life-threatening in Melbourne in 2022, “nobody should harm you without any reason”. Engr. Arnob told me (2018-2019) when I was residing in Savar, Dhaka, “Can we do bazar for your residence and your wife will cook food”. Engr. Arnob wears shirt and pant.

Engr. Nafiz, Assistant professor, City University told me (2018-2019), “Wife of Anowar Sir was looking like working lady when she was walking behind you, is she working lady or not?”. Engr. Nafiz told me (2018-2019), “Anowar sir is doing sex with his wife and writing manuscript regularly and regularly” Engr. Nafiz wears shirt and pant. He always kept bottom part of stripe color shirt inside of pant.

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Engr. Pubalina Samanta, Assistant professor/Lecturer, University of Calcutta told me in Dhaka airport, “if you come to Kolkata, you will stay in our house, not outside of house”. She wears salwar, kameez and orna.

A Professor of Mathematics told in City University, Dhaka Auditorium in the occasion of mathematics olympiad, “Everybody knows about cricket player, but nobody knows about research scholar”. His dress code was shirt and pant. He kept bottom of shirt inside of his pant.

I got eighteen mark out of twenty mark when I wrote a well prepared essay on ‘Bangladeshi farmers’ when I was attending in class six for my high schooling in Mohonpur public high school, Gopalpur, Tnagail, Dhaka, Bangladesh. I complained to head master that why should I get two mark less in my essay. It seems that there was a matter of more better, there was a scope of more improvement when there was no end point. Sometimes, I provide five mark out of five mark for narrative answer. I also provide ten mark out of ten mark for assessment in BSc engineering, City University, Dhaka. I also got hundred out of hundred in mathematics in different stage of schooling. In my master degree, I got forty five out 50 in Advances in Chemical Processing under Indian assessment policy; I got forty five out 50 in Chemical Processing and Functional Finishing under Indian assessment policy. For my PhD degree, I got sixty five out of hundred in OENG1085 Research Methods for Engineering under Australian assessment policy. I have seen few professors who don’t like to provide more than 60%/70% under their personal standardization if student write better and better, there is still lacking, there is still scope of improvement. Standardization of marking criteria is a global challenge for quality assessment. There is huge lacking of research and development. I didn’t see assessment standardization of answer script from primary schooling to PhD schooling in Bangladesh, India and Australia. Still now, assessment criteria of answer script depends on personal standardization of a professor. Although some criteria of assessments are being identified for professor, they are very limited for a quality assessment. In very starting years of grading system for secondary and higher secondary education in Bangladesh (2001, 2002), highest achievement of students were not good for comparing the years of next five years, there was also complain in Bangladeshi newspapers, there was also complain of Bangladeshi students/university for job assessment. In my BSc schooling, City University, 90% marks was the criteria for getting highest achievement of A+. Possibly it was a matter of student complain and highest achievement was shifted to 80%. Professor (Dr.) Sadhan Chandra Roy, University of Calcutta, India told me, “if my son/daughter checks my academic marks sheet/achievements, my son/daughter may comment to me that my father was not a good student”. It seems that there is variation of academic assessment trend under five years interval/ten

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years interval/twenty years interval of a country. For quality assessment in academic/professional viva-board, a viva board committee/members may have a chance to cheat with a candidate by making a very uncommon/hard question. Candidate may be dishearted for his Viva performance. A candidate can not understand that what is happening. A good candidate may lose confidence to continue his study for next stage preparation. A common question may be asked to all candidate in a competitive Viva Board although there is arrangement difficulties. Every assessment is always a tough matter for every assessor, we need to be careful for quality assessment based on quality criteria for quality selection.

Unknown people in village, Bangladesh told me when I was walking on the village road in evening/morning (2022-2023), “he (Engr. Anowar) looks like mad”. I had a casual dress code of t-shirt/polo shirt/old t-shirt. Rural unknown people also told me when I was walking on the village road when I had a dress code of shirt and pant, “he (Engr. Anowar) looks like professor, he looks like officer, he looks like job holder”. My late father, Late Md. Abdur Rashid, Medical practitioner told me in 2003-2004 when I had a dress code of shirt and pant, “you look like professor”.

Professors and students may have different color neck tie for global standardization. For example, professors may have red color neck tie and students may have black color neck tie. A single dress may be stitched/trialed by the combination of shirt, pant, tie and blazer. Keeping bottom part of shirt inside/outside of pants is a matter of good-looking body shape of male & female rather than t-shirt/polo shirt. A neck tie adds additional value for good-looking body shape of male and female. Presently tie is also considered as a part of fashion and textiles, it is not only a religious sign. Similarly, Panjabi is also considered as a part of fashion and textiles, it is not only a religious sign of Muslim people. Keeping bottom part of shirt inside/outside of pants should be standardized for teaching and learning environment under comfort feeling. People may feel comfort without dress but dress is mandatory for global practice of civilization. Keeping bottom part of shirt inside of pant is almost established globally for official dress under present invention of fashion and textiles.

Blazer is also good quality fashion both for male and female. Blazer ornaments body shape in an exceptional outlook under development of fashion and textiles. Wearing a blazer is not a

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matter of crime both of students and professors. I have a little positive assessment when my student ornaments with a blazar. In general, people are not wearing blazer during summer/the season of high temperature. Body temperature and personal feeling may differ person to person. Everyone can not wear a good-looking dress. This is a matter of regular practice, lifestyle, confidence, personal interest, discipline, good feeling, healthy feeling and psychophysics in general. A good-looking dress is not always a matter of professorship, chairmanship, presidentship, studentship, queenship, professionship but dress code standardization is necessary. For example, I saw a defence team walking beside my village residence in Bangladesh. A defence soldier wears uniform during morning exercise and evening exercise. A fabric quality can be matched perfectly for comfort feeling but still wearing a good-looking uniform is a regular motivation of a defence soldier. For example, I cannot wear a military/police dress, it is a matter of government penalty.

Both male and female practices full covering of body, half covering of body, quarter covering of body. Full covering fashion of body is always good looking rather than half/quarter covering of body. Full covering fashion of body is more civilized always rather than half/quarter covering of body. People practices half/quarter covering of body due to personal interest, comfort feeling, exercise dress, evening dress, morning dress, swimming dress, climate/weather relates to temperature in different regions of world. I saw an Australian professor who was supervising his Pakistani PhD student (Mr. Nauman Choudhury) who was wearing short pant and t-shirt.

Every student is a guest of a professor. Every student is a client of a professor/university. Every student is a customer of a professor/university. Professors have no value without student, cited by Professor (Dr.) Swapon Kumar Ghosh, University of Calcutta. Professor should feel that he is serving in a customer care unit of artificial brain development in an education department of a government. Every customer care people wear a good-looking dress to satisfy/motivate his customer. Every customer care people wear shirt, pant and tie in K-Mart, Australia. Professors are not customer of students. A good-looking customer is also a motivation of a professor. There is also a matter of establishing compliance relation between student and professor under government education policy, practiced by institutional quality assurance cell/research and development cell of knowledge industry all over the world.

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Dress is a matter of personal interest if there is no dress code from organization. Still now, defining a casual dress and a formal dress has no standardization internationally. Under present invention of dress code and/or fashion & textiles; shirt and pant are considered formal dress for male fashion; and t-shirt, polo shirt, trouser are considered as casual dress for male fashion & textiles in general. Presently the price of Lungi/men's skirt is also higher than pant in Bangladesh. If I wear a Lungi/men's skirt, I have no problem and I may feel more comfort. Bangladeshi male wears lungi for night dress. If I wear a lungi to satisfy a professor, my other colleagues may tease me another way. Male are not using skirt in office. Female skirt is also uncommon for office dress code. I am sorry to dissatisfy the people who try to direct me in wrong way rather than right way in life journey. Managing director, KE Technical Textiles Ltd. gifted a Lungi to a person came from France. Possibly the person was unable to wear Lungi. It was showed to him in office room that how to wear a 'Lungi'.

If you try to make a person small, he may be bigger; If you try to make a person bigger, he may be smaller; so, we need to judge perfectly whatever he is under a platform of academic assessment and professional assessment. Dress code is also a fact for primary evaluation. Although it is so tough to make right assessment under human limitation, we need to practice for better and better, right and right from a soft corner of human heart. Possibly every people have the behavior of envy, but the degree of envy varies man to man and the degree of control power also varies man to man. Envy + Envy + Envy + Envy = unexpected something = Life-threatening. Every people have mental affection and vigorous reaction. It is not a matter of educated, non-educated, BSc engineers, MTech engineers, PhD holder engineers, professors, doctorate degree, advocate, Barrister, president. Some educated people try to ignore violence and regularly suffers from the vigorous reaction of nonsense people. Official punishment/professional punishment is the prime solution before having the flow of life-threatening. In general, "nobody is perfect". We need to remember it when we are assessing other people, but we should not harm any people by thinking-by saying-by doing. Our life time is very limited and very crucial, our heart bit may stop any time, our blood flow may vibrate any time, our oxygen flow may stop any time, our psychophysics may change anytime, our brain may stop thinking anytime when every person has different psychophysics.

Self-motivation + Self-motivation = Self-development. I got a lot of motivation from professor/Dr./professional community for my self-development. Similarly, I also got demotivation/harassment from different point of my academic and professional journey, still I am

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climbing and climbing. Few people may not push in forward direction from back side, but there is person to pull in backward direction from back side. As every people have different psychophysics; we need to believe ourself for doing something better; we need to try for climbing and climbing until the last breath of life journey. Surrounding people may be tired and tired for pulling back for those peoples who are trying and trying, climbing and climbing.

I (Md. Anwar Hossain) worked and worked, I was silent and silent, I was climbing and climbing, I was struggling and struggling, I was writing my PhD thesis and writing my PhD thesis, I was communicating and communicating with supervisors, I was coming to laboratory and coming to laboratory, my relation with my colleague was growing and growing, Research flavor was spreading and spreading in RMIT PhD school. In the meantime, I faced hidden life-threatening in Melbourne in RMIT PhD school, chief executed by/administered by Professor (Dr.) Rajiv Padhye. I notified to whole RMIT University through Professor (Dr.) Alec Cameron, Vice Chancellor, RMIT University.

We should be careful to choose a perfect word or sentence when we are talking with others in family office and/or professional office in national and international platform. A voice of a person is the assessment criteria of a person for his personal character. A voice is a personal trademark in a professional office and/or family office. A voice is a personal signboard in a professional office and/or family office. A professional voice is a matter of right practice and right practice in family office and professional office. A political person attacks his opposition party by his voice in public media when there is no practice/lacking of practice of right punishment and/or lacking of right punishment in national and international platform all over the world. A political person leads the country all over the world. Verbal threatening is very common all over the world. We feel good when a bird is singing by his right voice when a person is saying professional by his right voice when a judge is saying professional by his right voice when an advocate is saying professional by his right voice when a medical practitioner is saying professional by his right voice when a doctor is saying professional by his right voice when a professor is saying professional by his right voice when a prime minister is saying professional by his right voice when a president is saying professional by his right voice when a parliament member is saying professional by his right voice when a father is saying professional by his right voice when a mother is saying professional by his right voice when a chairman is saying professional by his right voice when a director is saying professional by his right voice when a manager is saying professional by his right voice when a chief executive officer is saying
