# Data Exchange and Use Guidelines and Principles Meeting

Location: OPERAS Office - Conference Room: Quai aux Briques 76, 1000 Brussels, Belgium

### Meeting Objectives<sup>1</sup>

This working meeting will lead ~25 thought leaders to actively identify and develop an initial set of OA book usage data use policies and participation requirements for the OA Book Usage Data Trust. Participants will be asked to consider what is needed to ensure ethical data use and to foster trust among the diverse OA Book Usage Data Trust participants, including commercial and public usage data contributors and those who leverage the data exchanged through the OA Book Usage Data Trust's data space. Specifically, we will work to:

- 1. Define what's needed for trusted, ethical OA ebook usage data (OAEBU) exchange and use, such as:
  - o data quality levels/requirements for data trust inclusion (*i.e.* standards, PIDs)
  - desired raw OAEBU data processing in the data trust, to provide for security, privacy, and data aggregation
  - allowable and prohibited uses of raw data accessed through the data trust
- 2. Identify any compliance mechanisms and "data usage policies" that are required to retain trust among data trust participants
- 3. Determine the minimum required technical, organizational, or legal requirements to participate in the data trust as as a usage data provider and usage data consumer

Draft language emerging from this workshop will be vetted through virtual consultations and conference feedback sessions with OA book stakeholders in the summer and fall of 2023. Resulting principles and policies will then provide the basis for data trust participation terms and data sharing agreements for the global OA Book Usage Data Trust.

Note: this is not a technical workshop - rather it focuses on principles and policy development to uncover the terms that public agencies and repositories, not-for-profits, and private enterprises will require to trust that the usage data they exchange through the OA Book Usage Data Trust's data space ecosystem is used in an ethical, non-harmful way that generates a public good.
