



Nenets

- > Samoyedic > Uralic
- Two languages: Tundra and Forest Nenets
- Forest Nenets is much less documented and described
- 21,926 speakers (2010), about 2,000 of whom speak Forest Nenets
- Agglutinative with some fusional tendencies
- NOM-ACC language
- head final, SOV
- no genus
- singular, dual, plural
- rich case system, complex verbal morphology





- Corpus based: corpus currently being assembled in Hamburg within the INEL project
 - Planned to be published by the end of 2024
 - Archived data, unpublished and published texts
 - Narratives and folklores
- Here: a total of 457 existential, possessive and locative sentences in Forest and Tundra Nenets





Existentials and Locatives in Nenets

- Descriptions (mostly) only take Tundra Nenets into account
 - Tereshchenko 1973, Wagner-Nagy 2011, 2016, Nikolaeva 2014, Mus 2022
- Distinction of existentials and locatives based on linking element (among other features)
 - Hegedűs et al. (2017) already note that the distribution might not be as straightforward as presented








Existentials in Forest Nenets data: summary

- The existential verb is not the only linking element used in existential predication in Forest Nenets
- Tendency: Human figures seem to be unlikely to be used with only the existential verb




- Postural verbs are rarely used
- Linking element can be dropped
- Question of the two Nenets: structural differences or simplification in the presentation of Tundra Nenets?

'And then there are four reindeer.'

true person-NOM.PL exist-NAR.3sG.S be-DUB.3sG.S

'If there were real humans [...]. '

'[...] there were many fishes in the big lake.'

(11) M'ad m'u-n'a čet xal'm'ar jus'ida.

tent.GEN.SG inside-LOC.ADV four dead.man lie.3sG.S

'There were four dead men in the tent.'

(12) M'ad xew-xana xan-? ŋoka-?

tent.GEN.SG side-LOC.SG sledge-NOM.PL many-NOM.PL

ti-? ŋoka-?.

reindeer-NOM.PL many-NOM.PL


'There were many sledges and deer around the tent.'









Summary

- The existential verb appears only in existential predication
- Copula verbs appear in both: existential and locative predication
 - In locative predication, there is a strong tendency for the use of *me* with animate and *ŋa* with inanimate referents
 - the distribution is more complex in existential predication
- the parameters that determine whether the existential verb or a copula is used in an existential construction are (still?) unclear.
- Apart from locative sentences in Tundra Nenets, the linking element can be dropped
- Postural verbs play a minor role and do not seem to be used systematically.
