

Starting points

 "contrary to article publishing in journals (especially in the areas of Science, Technology, and Medicine) academic books have not been a focus point for open access (OA) policymakers. Consequently books are only rarely mandated to be published OA by research funders and institutions." (Grant Agreement of the PALOMERA Consortium)

Objective 1

To develop and coordinate a knowledge base with qualitative and quantitative data on OA book policies.

Objective 2

To understand challenges by analyzing policy documents and interview transcripts according to the PESTLE scheme



Objective 3

To engage relevant stakeholders through validation events and communication activities



To help develop policies and strategies by providing ressources and recommendations



Objective 5


To share ideas and experiences with organizations outside the EU
