The Publish OA team would like to thank all publishers who responded to this survey and who continue to engage so generously with this project.

Summary

The Irish government's National Open Research Forum funds projects with the aim of improving Ireland's open access landscape by implementing priority actions. PublishOA.ie was one of the six projects awarded funding by NORF under the 2022 Open Research Fund. The project's overall aim is to evaluate the feasibility of establishing a diamond open access platform for journals and monographs in Ireland. As part of this evaluation, Publish OA's second working group responsible for Work Package 2 – Feasibility Study Part 1: Building momentum/Stepping stones – was tasked with evaluating the landscape of publishing in Ireland, identifying gaps and providing appropriate support. Desk research was performed to create a Directory of Irish publishers and all publishers in this Directory were contacted via a survey to check details in the Directory and engage with publishers on initial evaluation of the publishing landscape in Ireland that will be followed by a World Café, focus groups, semi-structured interviews and training/support on specific areas.

Introduction

The Irish government's [National Open Research Forum](#) (NORF) funds projects with the aim of improving Ireland's open access (OA) landscape by implementing priority actions. [Publish OA](#) was one of the six projects awarded funding by NORF under the 2022 Open Research Fund. The project was launched in November 2022 and is funded for two years. Its overall aim is to evaluate the feasibility of establishing a diamond OA¹ platform for journals and monographs in Ireland.

Publish OA is co-led by the [Royal Irish Academy](#) and [Trinity College Dublin](#) and includes partners from the higher-education institutes in Ireland who contribute [members](#) to the project's five working groups.

As part of the evaluation, the second working group (WG2) responsible for Work Package 2 – Feasibility Study Part 1: Building momentum/Stepping stones – was tasked with evaluating the landscape of publishing in Ireland, identifying gaps and providing appropriate support. Prior to Publish OA's work, there had been no public, centralised list of publishers active on the island of Ireland. Further to this, there was no compiled data on the scope of OA publication being undertaken by Irish publishers, nor on their interest or readiness to engage in OA publishing. To address these gaps, Publish OA surveyed the Irish publishing community and invited them to participate in semi-structured interviews and/or participate in a focus groups/adapted World Café events, dependent on publisher preferences. Publish OA sought to collect and formalise data on which publishers are currently operating in Ireland and to investigate the scope of their OA publishing practices. The [methodology](#) for this study and its [results](#) are given below.

¹ Diamond open access is defined by [Science Europe](#) as 'a scholarly publication model in which journals and platforms do not charge fees to either authors or readers'. The type of publishing platform in question is one that allows for end-to-end publishing of journals and/or monographs and that is flexible in terms of interoperability with other publishing tools/software, publishing workflows, ecommerce needs and discoverability, among others.

Methodology

1. Directory – desk research

Publicly available data were sourced from the following websites: [Publishing Ireland](#), the [Arts Council](#), [Directory of Open Access Journals](#), [ISSN portal](#), [Science and Public Policy](#) and [Library Publishing Organisation](#). Other non-publicly available data were retrieved from the subscription service [Ulrich's List of Serials](#), and shared with the project by [Books Ireland](#) and [DIAMAS](#) via [Irish Open Access Publishers \(IOAP\)](#).

An Excel file was created with a tab for journals containing the following fields: 'source', 'publisher', 'publisher location', 'title', 'type of journal', 'ISSN', 'url', 'society/institution', 'OA', 'licence', 'APCs', 'language(s)', 'journal contact email', 'publisher contact name', 'publisher contact email', 'rights', 'OA policy', 'repository' and 'platform'.

Following discussions with the project working groups, this information was edited down to 'Book/journal publisher', 'Publishing house', 'ROI/NI', 'City/town', 'Journal titles (if applicable)', 'Type of publisher', 'If 'Other', 'Publisher's suggestion', 'Type of submission accepted', 'Publisher contact name', 'Publisher contact email', 'Generic email' and 'Publisher website'. This information was subsequently exported into the project database and published [online](#) on 15 June 2023.

2. Survey questions

Next the working group decided upon some questions to include in the survey to help with its aim of evaluating the landscape of publishing in Ireland, identifying gaps and providing appropriate support.

These questions were subsequently added to Microsoft Forms.

3. Ethics application


The project team made a minimal risk human research ethics application to Munster Technological University to cover the survey and this application was approved on 12 May 2023 under reference number HREC-MR-23-017.

4. Survey

Once the ethics application was approved, the survey was launched through Microsoft Forms and publishers contained in the survey were invited to complete it. The survey was also publicised via Publishing Ireland.

Results



Survey of Irish publishers

The PublishOA project is funded by the National Open Research Forum (NORF). Its overall aim is to assess the feasibility of establishing a national Open Access (OA) publishing platform for the island of Ireland.

As a first step, it published a *Directory of Irish publishers* on 16 June 2023 to help assess the current landscape of publishing in Ireland.

With this survey, the project aims to assess the initial needs of Irish publishers identified in the *Directory*, engage with this community and provide relevant support where possible.

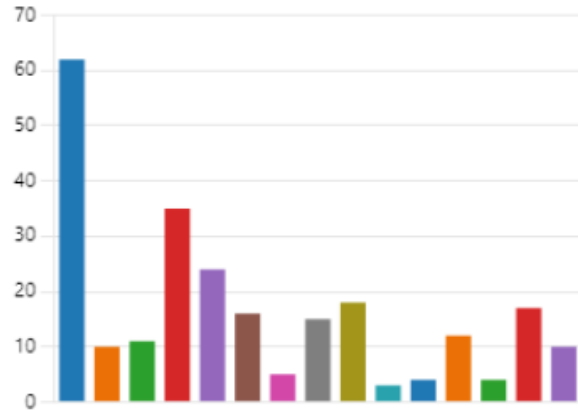

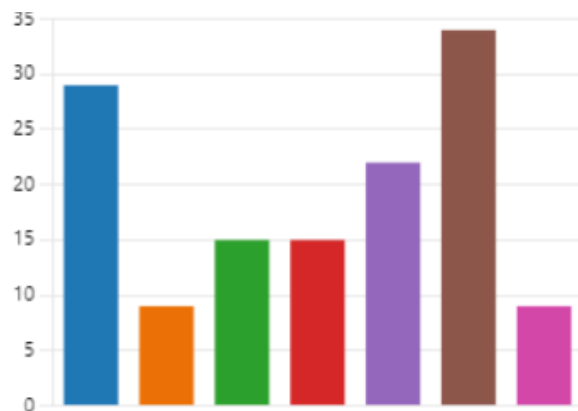

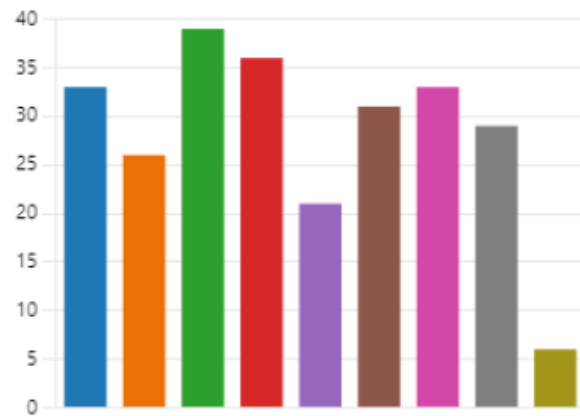
