## WHAT IS ORCID?

- An identifier for researchers
- A registry
- A set of standard procedures for connecting researchers to their affiliations and activities
- A committed community building connectors
- An international-scale open research effort



ORCID's vision is a world where all who participate in research, scholarship, and innovation are uniquely identified and connected to their contributions and affiliations across time, disciplines, and borders.






## **RESEARCH WORKFLOWS**






## THE ORCID COMMUNITY

- Over 3.1415m researchers, 1m records with at least one connection, 8m unique DOIs
- 644 members from 40 countries, consortia in the UK, Denmark, Finland, Sweden, Netherlands, Belgium, Germany, Italy, Taiwan, Australia, New Zealand, Canada and the US
- Over 550 integrations across sectors of the research community





# **COLLECT AND CONNECT!**

With hundreds of our members globally building ORCID identifiers into their systems, as well as some funders and publishers now requiring ORCID iDs, researchers are increasingly likely to encounter ORCID in their day-to-day life. We developed the Collect and Connect program to streamline the integration process and foster a shared user experience. This ensures researchers and our members understand what ORCID is and why and how to engage.










## **COLLECT!**



- Collect and store authenticated iDs
- Provide an ORCID-branded button for collecting iDs
- Explain benefits of having an iD for your researchers
- Explain benefits of including ORCID iDs at your site







- Store and publicly display iDs
- Display the ORCID iD with the iD icon, following ORCID guidelines
- Use the member logo when describing your organization's connection with ORCID
- Explain why you collect iDs



# **CONNECT!**



- Request permissions to write to/update the user's ORCID record to assert affiliation, works, etc OR
- Ingest information from ORCID records to autopopulate forms
- Explain the benefits of your system connections with ORCID




## **SYNCHRONIZE!**



- Create bidirectional information flow (synchronization) between ORCID and your system AND/OR
- Automatically update ORCID records AND/OR
- Create a search & link wizard
- In all cases, explain benefits to individual

#### Growing adoption of ORCID on Overleaf – over 5,000 linked ORCID accounts and four ORCID badges!

At the start of November 2016 we launched our integration with ORCID, to enable users to link their Overleaf account with their ORCID iD to help securely establish their identity and provide a quick way to login to Overleaf using their ORCID credentials.

We're delighted to announce that as of today, 5,295 Overleaf users have linked their ORCID accounts with their Overleaf account - equivalent to almost 50 per day since the launch! It's great to see such a rapid adoption of ORCID by our users, and reflects the growing adoption of ORCID as a standard, persistent identifier for researchers around the world.

We're also excited to have received our first four ORCID badges (who doesn't like badges?!) for officially conforming to the ORCID standards for Authenticating, Collecting, Displaying and Connecting the ORCID iDs on Overleaf. Check out our badge gallery below :-)

# What is ORCID, from a tech perspective?

A big (organized) pile of DATA
...plus TOOLS for using the data:

APIS (+ Website)

Application Programming Interfaces



# Huh?

# API = A way for other systems (like yours!) to interact with ORCID

- Get data out
- Put data in
- ...and a few other cool things!


# **COLLECT** authenticated iDs

#### It all starts here!



User clicks a link/button on your site, then signs into ORCID (or creates new account)

How about a live demo?!





# COLLECT authenticated iDs



We send the user back to a page on your site, with an authorization code added to the URI

Your system exchanges that code for an access token + user's ORCID iD

# **COLLECT** authenticated iDs



Store iDs and Access Tokens in your system - you'll need these to DISPLAY, CONNECT and SYNCHRONIZE (ie: get data from or add data to ORCID)



# Now that you have iDs stored in your system, display is easy:

No API request or Access Token needed - just follow our display guidelines





#### Remember those Access Token you stored?

Now you can use them to make API requests:

Get data

Add data



Per permissions you requested back at the COLLECT step





# ...and keep on adding/getting data whenever it changes in your system, or in ORCID

- Access Tokens are long-lived (20yrs)
- Webhooks can notify your system when ORCID records you're watching change

- Update/delete individual items



#### **INSTITUTIONAL SIGN-IN**


- Works already for many institutions!
   SURFconext & eduGAIN members, including US InCommon federation
- If yours doesn't work, some configuration may be needed Requires that you send a persistent NameID, eduPersonUniqueID (ePUID)
   OR eduPersonTargetedID (ePTID)





#### **INSTITUTIONAL SIGN-IN CROSS-LINK**

Automatically request iDs and record access permission from users who sign in via your institution









# COLLECT (+ DISPLAY)








**LOOP** gets permission to update a user's ORCID record, then adds a person identifier, connecting their ORCID iD to their Loop profile





#### **ImpactStory**


uses ORCID as a data source for providing insights into researcher impact.






# SYNCHRONIZE

**Crossref** gets permission to update a user's ORCID record, then automatically adds new works to the record when DOIs with the user's iD in their metadata are minted.
